Summer School Program Combines Education and Respect

The students of El Puente, thankful for the generosity they have received, give back by sponsoring a summer school program (*curso de verano* in Spanish) for the children in one of their hometowns. In July 2017, 78 girls and boys attended this year's program in the indigenous community of El Bothé, which is located in southern Querétaro State. The town provided a site for the event and your contributions allowed us to pay the costs of course materials, transportation, and meals.

The young beneficiaries of El Puente organized and managed various activities such as science classes, chess workshops, educational games and puzzles, and physical education. A fundamental theme of all the events was teaching the children to get along with their friends in a peaceful and respectful way. There were also group discussions that encouraged the kids to practice forgiveness and reconciliation. El Puente's Director writes that "in the future, we will continue to develop and enhance this subject. We're grateful for the support you provide and your confidence in the work done by these young people with the children in their communities. It really makes a difference"

Niños y Niñas Completes Speech Therapy Program



Our partner Niños y Niñas provides pre-school tutoring and social development programs to children from indigenous families who have moved to Querétaro. Last year, they used grant funds that we obtained from the Elmo Foundation to offer speech therapy to some of the kids who were lagging in their academic performance because of poor verbal skills.

Nineteen girls and boys participated over a period of 10 months and were evaluated at three points to measure their progress. They achieved most of the outcomes defined in the initial evaluations. There was improvement in verbal production of the children, as well as their ability to express themselves and collaborate with their peers. As the therapy continued, the increase in self-esteem of some the participants was significant. The evaluation also showed that some of the children suffered from malformations (such as tongue-tie and cleft palate) that caused their speech problems. These kids received medical treatment to alleviate their conditions.
