Wastewater Treatment

It has come to the attention of the Sewer Department that our City has an abnormally high amount of trash being flushed down the sewer system. Two different contractors have seen the conditions of our Sanitary Sewer Lift stations and agree that the amount of trash is high.

There are certain items which have been getting sent to the sewer system that should be thrown into the trash cans. These items include: 1 Feminine Hygiene products (i.e. tampons, applicators, & pads) 2. Shop towels 3. Baby/ Flushable wipes 4. Grease 5. Condoms. Note: Though the package says that the wipes are flushable, they don't break down in a timely manner and reach the treatment plant. According to the E.P.A. the only items besides human waste that should be flushed down the toilet is toilet paper.

The reason these items shouldn't been sent down the drain is the impact on the Sewer Collection systems as well as the Wastewater Treatment plant. Paper/string type items twist together to become cords that can get tangled in the pumps and other pieces of equipment. Grease tends to collect along the edges of the pipes and Lift Stations. It also glues other items like hair together and causes clogs. No one wants to have their sewer back up!



We can all work together to keep our sewer system as healthy and clean as possible. The fewer problems we have, the less it costs to run the system. The fewer problems we have, the savings gets passed along to the City as a whole. 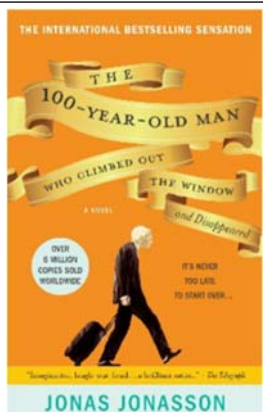
The Bluestockings Book Club Title Is...
