## **Fr. Larry's Reflection for July 13th**

This past week much of the nation's attention was fixed on the horrible flooding disaster in Texas. Despite the distance from Western Kentucky, we feel close to the people of Texas as they journey through unimaginable pain and grief. Our hearts feel sorrow for those who are lost, and concern for those who survive and have the difficult task of rebuilding. Disasters such as this always lead to the question of God's providence. How can God allow such horrible suffering? If God is all good, how can he permit such tragedy, especially as it affects innocent children? Of course, we could also ask the same question about the suffering of the people in Gaza, Ukraine, and Sudan. Where is God in all this? God seems to be silent.

God's answer to this question is clear, but it's one we've heard our whole lives, so it's easy to miss. I think God understands that no ordinary answer to this question would satisfy, especially those suffering or directly affected by suffering. So, God doesn't answer the question with an explanation; God does something far more impactful—God enters into our suffering and experiences it himself. In his crucifixion, Jesus, as God incarnate, fully experiences human suffering, not just the physical pain, but the isolation and sense of hopelessness. Instead of answering the question, why is there suffering, God suffers himself so that when we suffer, we can know that we are not alone. God understands suffering and tragedy because in Jesus, God suffered and died. Of course, this doesn't take suffering away, but it offers consolation to know that God is not absent, but fully present, loving and holding us in his divine embrace.

#### OUR LADY OF MOUNT CARMEL

The origins of this feast reach all the way back to the Old Testament. In the book of Kings, we read the story of the prophet Elijah. Much of his prayer, fasting, and public ministry occurred from Carmel, a mountain in Israel. Christian hermits -- seeking solitude -- made their homes on the mountain during the first millennium. Over time, the hermits assembled into a community and were given a Rule of Life. They named their church after Mary -- Our Lady of Mount Carmel. Political upheaval forced the Carmelite order out of the Holy Land and into Europe, where they established monasteries for both men and women across the continent. Many great saints and doctors of the Church have come from the Carmelite order, including St. Teresa of Avila, St. John of the Cross, St. Therese of Lisieux, and St. Edith Stein. Our Lady of Mount Carmel. Pray for us!

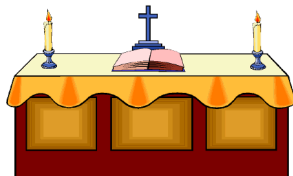
