REQUEST FOR PROPOSAL

The Nicholas County Commission is accepting sealed proposals to repair its gravel parking lot located on Whortleberry Avenue between Broad Street and Church Street in Summersville, West Virginia that was damaged by the June 2016 flood.

The Restoration of the Parking Lot according to the following Scope of Work -

- mobilization of grading equipment and material
- replace and grade washed out gravel surface course (minus 1-inch crushed rock)= 79.7 CY
- replace scoured surface course on the east side of the lot = 0.37 CY
- replace washed out parking lot exit road, surface course (minus 1-inch crushed rock) = 24.4 CY
- replace damaged geotextile fabric in exit road = 222.2 SY
  
- To make ready and install two drainage components;
  - A 12LF box-drain, located on-grade with general lot elevation and oriented across gravel ingress/egress driveway to intercept and divert runoff water into an approximate 65LF 8" HDPE pipe, southwest to,
  
  - A formed drop inlet (with approximate 3' X 3'grate), to be located in line with the open area between the above gravel parking lot and the County's Day Reporting building. The inlet must accommodate storm water from the above requested intercept and incorporate existing building's rooftop drains at the same location. Outlet drainage will utilize existing and directly-adjacent City of Summersville storm water system.

**A mandatory pre-bid meeting will be held on Wednesday, January 17, 2018 at 12:00 p.m.,** in the office of the Nicholas County Commission. A site visit will follow.

**All proposals are due** into the office of the Nicholas County Commission, Nicholas County Courthouse, 700 Main St., Ste. 1, Summersville, WV 26651 **no later than Wednesday, February 07, 2018 at 10:30 a.m.,** at which time the Commission will open said proposals during its regular scheduled meeting.
