TORBRECK

BAROSSA VALLEY

Torbreck has remained among the top Barossa properties since it burst onto the scene in mid 90s. The wines span a wide range of prices and production levels, but the quality is outstanding from top to bottom

Semillon has thrived in Australia for almost two hundred years, and Torbreck's bottling shows the classic toasty, waxy notes married with bright citrus and exotic fruit.

Yamakiri, or 'mountain fog,' is a true boutique winery, working with older, dry-farmed vineyards and stressing non-interventionist wine-making techniques and minimal “working” of the fruit.

Filigreen farm, the source of this Pinot Noir, is 100% biodynamic certified. The wine shows the savory streak of Anderson Valley, with earthy sous-bois supporting the bright mountain berry fruit.



Radio-Couteau is far from your “average” Pinot producing California winery. Unconcerned with trying to tap into the fickle trends of the wine-consuming public, Eric Sussman (owner and winemaker) is most concerned with letting the grapes express their terroir.

Red-fruited and intense, the 2013 'Neblina' cuvee (drawn mostly from the Sebastopol bench) is now starting to show its secondary characters and a savory, Asian spice component.

Widely considered the leading property for serious red wines in the Languedoc, Mas de Dumas Gassec has few equals in the area when it comes to producing wines of intensity and serious aging potential.

The 2014 is still a baby, with structure hiding a lot of the fruit and secondary and tertiary flavors waiting to emerge with time in the cellar. Enjoy now with a healthy decant, or forget about this in the cellar for a while.

POGGIO DI BORTOLONE®

Bortolone has been a wine-producing estate since around the turn of the 18th century. As subsequent generations have taken the helm, the winery has been modernized and the wines of Sicily have gained much more worldwide attention.

Frappato is Sicily's Gamay. It's a light, fresh and strawberry-driven wine that begs for poultry and seafood. Try with fried fish!

Laurel Glen's flagship Sonoma Estate Cab has been one of the most iconic wines from the county since its inception in the late 60s.

2013 was a classic drought vintage, with intensely flavored fruit and low yields combining to produce very age-worthy, potent example of California Cabernet. This wine is ready to pair with a ribeye or sock away in the cellar for another few years!

Knight's Valley is one of the original Sonoma county AVAs. It sports the hottest climate, making it perfect for warmth loving varieties like Cabernet and Merlot, but with serious temperature drops at night, freshness and structure are maintained.

The 2014 King Fish shows off deep blackcurrant and plum fruit, with toasty notes of oak and mocha. This is a hedonistic style of wine, equally at home on the dinner table or as a patio sipper!
