Public Works

As we move closer and closer to the winter months we also get closer and closer to snowy cold days. We would like to remind residents about our snow removal ordinance.

18.01.02 SNOW REMOVAL DECLARATION.

Such time the Director of Public Works or his or her designee determines that snow removal from the public streets will commence and declares a Snow Removal Alert.

18.01.03 SNOW ROUTE RESTRICTIONS-DESIGNATED.

By resolution of the City Commission, the City may designate certain City streets as Emergency and Secondary Snow Routes to ensure said streets can be cleared of snow for the safe and orderly flow of traffic and for the health, safety and welfare of the general public.

18.01.04 NO PARKING ON SNOW ROUTES.

No person may park or allow to remain parked any vehicle or trailer on any street designated as Emergency Snow Route or Secondary Snow Route during snowfall or prior to the time said street is cleared of snow by the City.

Vehicles or trailers parked on snow routes in violation of this section may be ticketed and/or towed at the owner's expense. Violations of this chapter shall be subject to the fine established by City Resolution.


New Homeschool/Middle School Book Club!




Yoga Classes Moved!

Watch What You Waste! News From Our WWTP

The items found in a wastewater system vary widely. Items vary by town, region and even by state. Coins, watches, shoes and rings are just a few items that have been found in a wastewater collection system. The only commonality is that most of the items are not "flushable"...

Now the rule of thumb is: if it has not been eaten or cannot be eaten, it should not go down the drain. The main exception to that rule is, of course, toilet paper. If you ask any wastewater system operator in South Dakota, "What is the worst thing you find in your system?" Invariably, the answer will be "Flushable wipes." The flushable wipe is a personal hygiene cloth that is deemed on the package as "flushable." It may say flushable, but the item is, however, not biodegradable. Therein lies the problem in a wastewater collection system, most "normal" material is biodegradable or also know as organics. Items that are inorganics may include sand, grit and minerals that can be dealt with mechanically in a wastewater system. Personal wipes do not break down and are of a material that resists being torn or cut and tends to plug or bind mechanical apparatuses.


Wastewater systems have spent many thousands of dollars in dealing wither personal wipes. Countless hours are spent clearing lift stations, pumps, baskets, screens and blockages all due to issues with personal wipes. Pump repair or replacement is not an inexpensive budget item, especially when the pumps life expectancy is shortened exponentially.
