- <u>License Social Worker</u> (LSW) or <u>License Clinical Social Worker</u> (LCSW)
- IDOE Student Services License, which requires practicum experience and knowledge of the school environment.

STUDENTS

- Increase academic success
- Improve Interpersonal relationships

Role In Special Education

SCHOOL SOCIAL WORKERS CAN:

- Consult with both general education and special education teachers to develop and/or implement pre-referral assessments and interventions
- Design and implement behavior management plans
- Participate on the multidisciplinary assessment and intervention core team.
- Provide social, emotional, behavior, functional, and adaptive assessments
- Meet with parent/guardian(s) to complete psychosocial histories
- Provide evidence-based social work services as a component of the Individualized Education Plan (IEP)
- Educate parents and school personnel regarding the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEIA) and Article 7
