

**Capacity of CHIP:** Since its founding, CHIP-I has focused on the three activities: promoting of awareness of autism, supporting methods of early identification and access to care, and the teaching of ABA . Due to high volume of special needs, training in learning disabilities is included. Below is a list of the work accomplished to date:

April 2011	Senegal, Three workshops on autism and ABA	<p>Mary Diop and Stamatios Gianoumis organize and lead workshops attended by 120 parents and professionals.</p> <p>The purpose was to explore the interest and openness in Senegal for discussing the sensitive topic of autism. The workshops confirmed the need and the interest of teachers in learning more. Parents were also interested in helping special needs/autistic children in the home.</p>
January 2012	<p>Senegal, Five-day training on ABA and Verbal Behavior, a high-level director from the Ministry of Education opened the training.</p> <p>The Government of Senegal has provided for “inclusive education” for its students. The training was organized by Mary Diop and in part with the First Lady of Senegal, the Minister of Education and a Senator.</p> <p>Stamatios Gianoumis was the consultant/trainer.</p> <p>The workshop was videotaped and a Senegalese television crew reported on the event.</p> <p>Pre- and post-evaluations of the workshop resulted in high scores for the content and teaching methods and instructor.</p>
