

A New Season

I hope and pray that as you read this note you are still noticing the many ways that hope makes itself known all around you and within you. Concluding our Roots of Hope worship series with the Story of Hope stewardship theme and then culminating it all with our Thanksgiving service and lunch on November 23rd was a beautiful experience to witness as your pastor. What I experienced throughout these last two months has been Hope UCC's living out Paul's words to the Roman church, "May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, so that you may abound in hope by the power of the Holy Spirit." We are called to use that energy to share that hope, joy, and peace. God willing, this is what we will do.

This month we begin a new season in the church year: Advent. When there is so much in this world that is fearful and casts shadows of doubt and distrust in our lives, Advent is a time that we face that darkness with the hope and trust and faith in God's promise of new life. The words of the God's angelic messengers feels more important than ever, "Do not be afraid; for see—I am bringing you good news of great joy for all the people." I recently read Rev. Fleming Rutledge's work on Advent. She writes that the original Advent themes were not hope, peace, joy, and love. "...the Medieval church designed the four Sundays of Advent around the themes of the four last things: death, judgment, heaven, and hell—in that order, so that the subject of hell was preached on the Sunday just before Christmas Eve. That was no accident. The idea was—and is—to show how the light of the birth of Christ appeared against a backdrop of darkness, depravity, and despair." That said, be not afraid, I will not be preaching about hell on Christmas Eve! However, as we enter this Advent season as the days are getting colder and darker, hear and hold God's promises close as we wait.






