

Why Mu Nu?

What is a middle ground in Christianity? We desire to be excellent in every way to honour Jesus, whom we love with all our heart. He is the Alpha and Omega, the Pioneer and the Perfecter of our faith. His Holy Spirit leads and guides us in all our life, as we submit to Him. We are enclosed in His love, and filled with His love till "our cup runs over".

Mu (μ) and nu (ν) are the middle two letters in the Greek alphabet. We have selected these two letters to symbolise our position in the Body of Christ as consistent with mainstream church.

- ◆ "All Scripture is God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness, so that the man of God may be thoroughly equipped for every good work." (2 Timothy 3:16 NIV)
- ◆ "I am not ashamed of the gospel, because it is the power of God for the salvation of everyone who believes ... for in the gospel a righteousness from God is revealed, a righteousness that is by faith ... " (Romans 1:16-17 NIV)
- ◆ "Salvation is found in no-one else, for there is no other name under heaven given to men by which we must be saved." (Acts 4:12 NIV)

Key Objectives

- ◆ To ensure that followers of Jesus have the assurance that they are born again (John 3:3) and have an anointing from the Holy One. (1 John 2:20)
- ◆ To encourage born-again followers of Jesus to believe that they are able to lead other people to meet and put their trust in Jesus, both within and especially outside the church building.

To equip born-again believers: "after they prayed ... they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and spoke the word of God boldly." (Acts 4:31 NIV)

Purpose

To enable born-again believers to fulfil our Lord's great commission and His expressed intention: "you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses ... " (Acts 1:8 NIV)

"Therefore go and make disciples of all nations ... " (Matthew 28:19)

"Anyone who has faith in me will do what I have been doing. He will do even greater things than these, because I am going to the Father." (John 14:12 NIV)
