Cobbles and Boulders

- used for retaining walls and as accent stones
- cobbles are a manageable sizes for easy installation
- several colors available



Outcroppings

- used for large retaining walls and accent stones
- several sizes available for specific project needs
- pulled from the quarry and palletize making it one of the greenest options available
- may need larger equipment for installation
- can match building stone for a symmetrical appearance from the building to the landscaping



Patio and Paving Stone

- used for walkways, patios, flower bed edging, and flower bed stepping stones
- steppers are smaller piece of stone that are easily manageable for do-it-yourselfers
- flagstone is large pieces of stone and are a more expensive option
- colonial pavers also make a good selection as a landscape edging.



Steps

- used for easier grade transitions in retaining walls and hillsides
- several standard sizes and finishes available for economical installation
- more appealing and unique then comparable concrete poured or premade steps for about the same cost
- for a more economical and rugged look use outcropping steps



Wall Stone

- used for retaining walls and edging
- snapped wall stone cut to standard depths of 6", 8" and 12"
- economical random wall stone is irregular shapes pulled from the quarry and palletize making it one of the greenest options available
- may be installed with minimal equipment needs
- can match building stone for a symmetrical appearance from the building to the landscaping
