

BY LAWS OF THE Apostolic Faith Bible College, Inc. Article VII Doctrine

It is recognized that the true church of Jesus Christ consists of all believers who believe in the saving grace of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ and who have accepted Him as their personal Savior. It is recognized and agreed that no organization or man has been granted authority by the Lord to exclude from or accept anyone into the Kingdom of Heaven, as this is done by Jesus Christ only. It is further recognized and agreed that we as Christians are to love all members of the Body of Christ (Christians). and this love and fellowship derives from the unity instilled by the Holy Spirit. Although differences in doctrinal beliefs and interpretations should not influence our love for one another, adherence to similar doctrinal beliefs and modes of worship have bonded together those of the Apostolic Faith Movement as founded by Charles F. Parham in the early 1900's. The scripture teaches us to adhere to the truth and proper doctrine. The common doctrinal beliefs are essentially as follows.

- * Triune God; Father, Son, and Holy Spirit
- * Creation and Formation
- * Man is basically sinful and in need of salvation
- * Salvation by Grace upon repentance toward God and acceptance of Jesus Christ as one's personal Savior, which is the conception of Spiritual Life
- * Sanctification of the Spirit, Soul, and Body, A second definite work of Grace by the Lord Jesus Christ
- Baptism of the Holy Spirit; evidenced by the speaking in other languages.
- Water Baptism (of all believers) by immersion in water in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit
- * Sacrament of the Lord's Supper
- Washing of feet
- * Divine Healing through Jesus Christ for all believers
- * Do not condone divorce and remarriage
- Destruction of the wicked
- * Conditional Immortality
- Rapture of the Man Child Class
- * Return of Jesus Christ to earth again; bodily and visibly
- * A ministry supported by tithes and offerings

These doctrines shall be adhered to in the teachings of the Apostolic Faith Bible College, which in addition to other doctrinal teaching approved by the Board from time to time if they are not inconsistent with the above listed basic doctrines.

This note is to inform all of our Apostolic Faith voters of important information concerning the Apostolic Faith Bible College Board of Trustees. On Friday, Dec. 4, 2015, Bro. Fred Huff called Bro. Richard Morris and gave his verbal resignation from his position as Board President effective immediately, citing personal and private reasons for his decision. I would like to say that I appreciate the years of service that Bro. Fred has given to AFBC and for the relationship that he and I have had during my term as Superintendent.

On Sunday evening, Dec. 6, 2015, the remaining Board members, with Bro. Richard Morris chairing as acting President, met by conference call to discuss the process of sending out ballots for voters to elect another person to fill and complete Bro. Fred's elected term. It was discussed and agreed upon to postpone filling this position until February when normal re-election process takes place. This will reduce the cost of mail outs and will allow all the open positions in each district to be mailed out together. The following Board positions will on the voting ballots in February.

However our ministry is not confined within the four walls of the church. We have been re-assigned to an outreach of extraordinary possibilities. Each day brings with it the opportunity of service as the Lord designs. The orchestration of our ministry lies in His hands and the design of how it occurs, with whom it occurs and when it occurs is a masterpiece of a divine encounter,



In the past 50 years I have pastored, taught, evangelized, conducted marriage seminars and served on several mission boards working along side with the Apostolic Faith and the Full Gospel Evangelistic Association as well as serving on the board of Faith West Inc. In 1988 we established Green Tree Ministries Inc., a personal ministry for the purpose of assistance and encouragement. When we are at home I work

Although my position is director of facilities, it affords me opportunities to touch the lives of students, staff and parents daily. These types of ministries allow us to function in our calling while making a living and it opens the doors of ministry outside of the walls of the local church. I guess you would say that we are diverse in our ministry, but we are functional and well-designed in our calling. One word cannot define us, one title cannot describe us and one action of service does not exemplify who we are or how we serve the Lord.

Encouragement is a key component in our ministry as we strive to reach out in any way we can serve and help lift the burdens of life. Our deepest desire is to reach those in full-time ministry. Perfection in service should never be the goal, however strengthening the feeble knees of those who serve others is a powerful and sometimes forgotten outreach. We are by no means the answer, we are just willing helpers. The Lord has allowed us to preach in many different congregations and we have lovingly been blessed to assist pastors and their wives as well as lay couples dealing with struggles. I believe that as sons and daughters of our living God we can prepare to serve outside of the church a swell as inside. Believers sometimes need a new perspective, a safe place to share and gain direction for hopes deferred.

With the shifting of our assignments we also must make adjustments within our families, because very seldom does only one thing in our lives change. So, Brenda likes to think of herself these days as a personal assistant as well as CEO of our household in charge of life products, new and existing, She is the financial manager, director of anger management, therapist of all tears, teacher of hope, lifeguard, trainer. and the exclusive administrator of basic emotional embrace affecting the future day to day living with optimum outcome. And once in awhile she cooks, cleans and writes a journal!

Where Has The Holiness Gone?

Psalm 19:14— <u>Let the words of my mouth, and the meditation of my heart, be acceptable in thy sight, O Lord, my strength, and my redeemer.</u>

_This lesson taken from the Psalm is so brief but will hopefully only serve as a catalyst for further study. I believe attention needs to be given to the last part of the verse that reveals where David wanted to find approval with God. He wanted the words of his mouth and the meditation of his heart to be acceptable (where?) IN THE SIGHT OF GOD. This enters into the Bible Doctrine truth of what is called God's omniscient (knowing everything, all seeing). Nothing escapes His attention! Read Psalm 139 for a reminder of God's insight.

Remember how many times we read about the kings of Judah and Israel doing either good or bad in the sight of the Lord, such as II Chronicles 14:2; "And Asa did that which was good and right in the eyes of the Lord his God." An interesting verse from a seer to Asa in II Chronicles 16:9 reads, "For the eyes of the Lord run to and fro throughout the whole earth, to show Himself strong in the behalf of them whose heart is perfect towards Him." (Check the Biblical account for the occasion of this).

In the New Testament, the Bible records in John 3:19: And this is the condemnation, that light is come into the world, and men loved darkness rather than light, because their deeds were evil. For every one that doeth evil hateth the light, neither cometh to the light, lest his deeds should be reproved." Ah... the subject of being reproved; of being found out before God, the exposure of wrong deeds and being brought up on the charges. Wrong language Sorry, I guess I was thinking of convicts; of people that have broken the law and... (Hm. Maybe the language is not so wrong!) But can the darkness really hide us? Going back to Psalm 139:11 and 12 we read "If I say, Surely the darkness shall cover me: even the night shall be light about me. Yea, the darkness hideth not from thee, but the night shineth as the day, the darkness and the light are both alike to thee."

Out of all the instances that we could talk about from the Bible, let me offer only two. I really like the verse in Matthew 9:36,"But when He saw the multitudes, He was moved with compassion on them, because they fainted, and were scattered abroad, as sheep having no shepherd." When Jesus saw the crowd, He didn't just see them as a 'mob' of people, but really saw them as individuals that were lost and could not find their way. He saw the people for who they were and what they needed. Oh, how great to have the gaze of Jesus rest upon you... unless you're Peter in Luke 22. He had just denied Jesus, the rooster has crowed "And the Lord turned, and looked upon Peter." And Peter remembered the word of the Lord, how He had said unto him, "Before the cock crow, thou shalt deny me thrice. And Peter went out and wept bitterly."

.Oh the vision of God! His penetrating stare! How gracious for Him to be the Overseer, the Supervisor of our souls (I urge you to do a word study of II Peter 2:25). I'm sure His children always enjoy being 'watched over' by their Father... don't we? But although we know this fact, I'm not sure we always live like it. I mean, don't we act like sometimes no one sees us?

I've hard the song about 'santa' that "you'd better watch out, you better not cry, you better not pout, I'm telling you why"...And it goes on to say something about having a list and checking it twice to find out who is naughty and nice...and then it says that santa clause is coming to town (which is...well, I'll leave that for now). The 'facts' are presented that, "he sees you when you're sleeping, he knows when you're awake; he knows if you've been bad or good (and then come s the warnings)so be good for goodness sake." There are a lot of similarities here you know. The Bible has much to say about 'watching' and crying (do we whine?) and pouting (we would never throw temper tantrums at our age....would we?). The Bible does say something about there being a Lambs Book of Life that names are written down in. We know that He knows when we sleep and have our uprisings (hmmm) and I do think that we had better be good for His sake (and ours). But lastly one thing I do know: Jesus is THE ONE that is coming and He is the One who knows ALL about us. Let's not kid ourselves.

Let me press on with a very sobering thought here. I believe God not only to see our actions, but also knows our motives; He sees not only what we do but why we do it. We may do the right thing but if why we are doing it is wrong, is the action of any real value in sight?

Sometimes our actions scream "watch this" when we preach, or teach or clean the church bathroom but we are not so eager for [people to see us when we are lazy or unproductive... or stumbling in and out of Christianity.

Isn't there a natural tendency though for us to want to receive recognition for the good we've done? Or being concerned of getting credit? How wise we are at times in our own eyes when it's in His sight; His view of us that should be most important... isn't it? We've talked about what does the world see when they look at us? An equally provocative question might be when God looks at us, does He see the world?

It seems one can rarely be anywhere without being observed by someone. How many times have you ever seen the gentle reminder in a store "smile, you're on camera"? But even with the admonition to smile, you know that somewhere some stranger is watching you to make sure that you don't get away with doing something that is wrong. And that makes us uneasy! But friend, I've got to tell you, there's an all seeing eye watching you; God your Father is always watching, not solely with the intent of catching us doing wrong {I have a feeling that He would rather see us do random deeds of kindness). but that He might see when we are down or in trouble, etc. There may be times when I wish He didn't see, but really, I'm so glad He does.... Aren't you? Whatever He sees us do, let it be with the desire from us that He is pleased with it and He can say, at the end of our day that our conduct which is the result of our motives has been acceptable. After all, the song that we've been referring to "O Be Careful" ends with the phrase..."for the Father up above is looking down in love."

Let us hold fast the profession of our faith without wavering; for he is faithful who promised. Hebrews 10:23






