- Although we celebrate Month of the Military Child all month long, Wednesday, April 21 is a special day that Virginia 4-H will celebrate the strength of military youth. Everyone across the state is invited to join us in celebrating Purple Up! For Military Kids Day by wearing something purple on April 21. Groups may select an alternate Purple Up date in April.

- 5. During April, interested youth and adults across the state may choose to participate in the VA 4-H Month of the Military Child Photo Challenge. The goal is for military youth to see they have our thanks & support. Participants of the photo challenge simply select the subject of their photo from the following:
  - MOMC spelled with toys or household items
  - A purple ribbon tied on a tree
  - A door decorated for Month of the Military Child
  - An American Flag flying in your community
