Business Licenses

The Town of Preeceville would like to remind everyone that to conduct business within the Town of Preeceville, any person who is a contractor, home based business operator, petty trade business operator or a transit trader must obtain an annual business license. All business licenses expired on December 31st, 2021 and must be renewed to be valid for the 2022 year.

Eco Centre Open

The Eco Centre is open again for the 2022 season. The Eco Center accepts all your used oil, oil filters, antifreeze, and diesel exhaust containers. The Eco Center hours are from 8:00 am to 12:00 noon every Tuesday, Wednesday, Friday and Saturday.

Elm Tree Pruning Ban

Once again, the Elm Tree Pruning Ban is in effect from April 1st through to August 31st as it is each year to prevent the spread of Dutch Elm disease.
