Lenten Sermon Series

The season of Lent is a time for us to assess ourselves and make adjustments. It's a time for us to recalibrate to God's way of living and loving. The purpose of repentance and reflection is not to lay ourselves under condemnation, but to offer ourselves up for salvation. This is very important: "God did not send his Son to condemn the world but to save the world through him" (John 3:17).

Jesus did not come to condemn us but to save us. He wants to set us free. In Christ, we can let go of the sin and shame that seek to enslave us. Letting Go is an 8-week sermon series that will teach our church Jesus did not come merely to set us free from the consequences of our sins (i.e., offer forgiveness only). He came to set us free from the power of sin.





March 5, 2023: Born Anew- Those who are "born anew" lock their focus onto the crucified and resurrected Christ who now dwells in us by the Holy Spirit. Our life starts to look like the life of Jesus: we are daily crucified as we pick up our cross and follow him, but we are also daily resurrected with life, love, and joy. We are immersed ("baptized") into the life of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. When this happens we have "entered the kingdom of God" that Jesus speaks about.



March 12, 2023: Set Free From Shame- The story of the Samaritan woman perfectly illustrates how God sent Jesus not to condemn the world but to save the world through him. Jesus humbles himself, engages the woman in conversation, and sets her free from shame and guilt. She arrives at the well as a sinner, but leaves as a saint. Encounters with God will do that to someone, even YOU!



March 19, 2023: Clinging to Jesus- Jesus heals a blind man starting him on a journey of discovery that will last for eternity. The Pharisees show themselves to be the blind ones, as they were well-versed in their scriptures and their laws but they were far from knowing the God of creation whose heart is full of love and light. As Christ followers we must cling to Jesus rather than become like the Pharisees who valued knowing about God more than walking with God.



March 26, 2023: Our Greatest Hope- The story of Lazarus teaches us that God seldom meets our expectations but instead fulfills our greatest hopes. His timing is not our timing nor are His ways our ways. But He is faithful always, He is worthy to be praised, and He is a safe place for us to put all our hope.


Tuesday Night Fellowship and Adult Bible Study

Global Mission Fellows become active parts of their new local communities. They connect the church in mission across cultural and geographical boundaries. They grow in personal and social holiness and become strong young leaders working to build just communities in a peaceful world.

One GMF is Adolé Gloria Rébécca Akue, who is engaged in a two-year term of service.

Adolé is a member of Salem Parish Methodist Church of Togo, Lomé. A Sunday school teacher and member of La Voix Divine choir, she serves on the national youth commission and is a host of Gloire à Dieu, the voice of the Methodist Church in Togo. "I teach our hymns to Sunday school children, prepare them for singing performances and teach them how to conduct worship," she said.

Adolé holds a Bachelor of Science degree in biology from the University of Lomé.

"Growing spiritually," Adolé said, "requires certain sacrifices and work on oneself." She prays regularly and studies the Bible, learning "in every situation (to) give thanks to God."

"God does everything in His time, and everything works together for those who love God."

As a Global Mission Fellow, Adolé hopes to enrich her skills in health, nutrition, social services and singing and focus on the rights of women and children.

"Working in mission," she believes, "will allow me to test my faith even more, see where I am in my journey with Christ and see how far my faith can take me in the face of challenges."

The gentle movements create elasticity and open blockages throughout the whole physiology including the musculoskeletal and circulatory systems as well as connective tissue and organs. *Taoist Tai Chi*® practice is also a form of meditation that has a profoundly calming effect on the nervous system and the brain.

Falls are a normal part of life, yet we all know they can be life-altering events. Falls are especially devastating among older adults as they are a leading cause of hospitalization due to injury and a major reason for admission to a residential care facility. Fear of falling can itself affect our lives as we begin to avoid certain situations.

Research into Tai Chi provides excellent evidence of benefit for preventing falls, improving balance, strength, and increasing mobility. With *Taoist Tai Chi*® practice you can feel more stable on your feet, increase your confidence, strength, resilience, and stamina. It helps improve posture, alignment, and balance and allows you to move more freely. With increased flexibility, even if you fall, there is less chance you will have a serious injury. Falls among adults age ,65 and older are very costly. Each year about \$50 billion is spent on medical costs related to non-fatal fall injuries and \$754 million is spent related to fatal falls. Good Friday


April 7, 2023, Worship time: 12:00 pm
