#### **IDEAL 18 FLEET UPDATE**

Four weeks into the spring frostbiting season our fleet of Ideal 18s hold the top three places in the class. With only15 points, Tom and Dan, with Priscilla Robinson as alternate, have won the day twice. Cindy Gibbs with 29 points in second has also won a day and opened up a lead over Jon Gibbs with 35. In fourth, member Ed Birch sailing with Rob Reichard, rounds out an ECYC sweep with 45 points.

We have been working with Essex Yacht club to co-ordinate our summer racing programs. EYC and ECYC will be promoting Tuesday night racing for Intermediates and skippers looking to sharpen their racing skills. Thursday night racing this summer will remain a spinnaker class. ECYC will host the EYC/ECYC team race in September. The racing and ladies clinics will also share a fleet on several occasions. Cindy and Tom are working with EYC on the details. The club boats will also be available for the Tri-Club River Races, consisting of the Willets, Clark, and Birch Memorial, this fall.

As our program continues to grow, we are working to codify our system of crew boat assignments. We have been able to accommodate all qualified skippers and crews to date. It works best when teams with a skipper, crew, and alternate crew sign up as a team before the season begins. We also will continue to assign an open boat to get individuals and newcomers into the game.

Shortly, the boats will be available everyday (except on Frostbiting Sundays) for use by member skippers and their guests, providing that they have been pre-qualified to do so by Ed Birch or Cindy Gibbs. Note that for the Frostbiting season our racing jibs are removed daily to extend the longevity of their competitiveness.

### House Committee Update:

The planter boxes in front of the building made their transformation to spring complete, just in time for the fantastic Easter Brunch prepared by our partners Coastal Cooking Company. The transition from winter greens to spring pansies was done by Nina Thurston. Please join me in expressing appreciation for her efforts for all of us to enjoy!

Under the heading of "things just never seem to get completed", there will be a work day on Saturday April 16 to finish the top coat of paint for the main deck railing. The fun will start at 11AM (weather permitting) using brush and roller to (finally) get the trim paint applied. Last fall we started this Odyssey with multiple scraping, sanding, cleaning, and primer coat sessions and individual weekday efforts to get us to this point. But time and/or energy ran out before the final top coat could be fully applied. We will get this done before May 1.

Please consider coming down if even for an hour or two. I am convinced that if we could get 10 to 12 folks slinging brushes and rollers, this would be done before afternoon tea.

Immediately following the railing effort, in early May the task will be the recoating of the deck surface. Rental of a sander for the tough and large surface will be step one. Once most of the existing painted surface of the decking is sanded off a stain will be applied, to avoid the peeling experienced in previous resurfacing applications. This effort will get us through 2016, and possibly 2017, while the long term renovation of the deck is planned and designed.

On the topic of long term improvements, the key areas I've identified in the past are underway for initial definition, design, and costing.

The steps include:

- Gary Sharpe is developing the project factors for replacement and enhancement of the River Room river facing window and door.
- Terry Stewart is pursuing options for the replacement of the building alarm system.
- I'm pursuing the front door and front of building enhancement design.
- Rear deck refurbishment plan and design remains to have a volunteer
- Sunroom window replacement evaluation remains to have a volunteer.

I remain hopeful to have the bulk of this season's projects wrapped up by Memorial Day to ensure the summer of 2016 can be enjoyed with ECYC looking as best as can be, and as much free time as possible.

Thanks, and please help whenever you can to support the work efforts of the next couple of months.

# Strategy Planning Update:

The group of members who have been involved in the strategic planning exercise (the working group) met on March 25th. The work undertaken at that meeting constituted a milestone.

Over the past few months the following has been accomplished:

The exercise began with an analysis' of the strengths, weaknesses, opportunities and threats faced by the organization. This is a so called SWOT analysis. We augmented this process with a risk assessment wherein we assessed each weakness, opportunity and threat against likelihood and severity. The results of this process were then plotted on one chart with a likelihood axis and a severity axis. This served to identify matters that needed to be addressed soon, matters that need to be monitored but not necessarily addressed now and, finally, matters that were sufficiently immaterial to be ignored.

At the last two meetings the working group looked at these results and identified what can be called "kernels" of strategies to address these matters. We are now at the point where smaller groups with specific knowledge need to be organized to develop detailed strategies. There probably is no need for the full working group to meet again (although they probably will be involved in the new smaller groups). I thank them for their efforts.

# Green Tip of the Month:

## PLEASE SAY NO TO BALLOONS!

Springtime means that wedding and graduation season is just around the corner. It also means parties, food, drinks, beautiful decorations - and often balloon releases.

Latex and mylar balloons may look pretty, but like everything else, if not properly disposed of, can be very dangerous and even life-threatening to wildlife. Latex balloons, in particular, can kill sea turtles and fish, as well as seabirds, and even larger ocean dwellers like dolphins, whales and other cetaceans can suffer from dangerous health conditions after ingesting balloons.

There really is no such thing as a "biodegradable latex balloon". The balloon industry claims that some latex balloons "degrade as quickly as an oak leaf". Well, oak leaves can take as much as four (4) years to degrade, so that is a long time for a balloon fragment to wreak havoc among wildlife. It is also not true that balloons burst into "really small fragments". Balloon fragments are often sizable and don't look that great littering our environment, and even if they burst into smaller pieces it only means that smaller animals will also ingest them. Animals get entangled in the strings attached to balloons and often strangle or choke to death. Not a happy result of a celebration that started out happy!

Mind you, I am not telling anyone NOT to enjoy balloons - just asking to forgo balloon releases, because the winds will take them out of our reach and they can end up in the water or in wilderness areas, or even in your



backyard. If you really cannot celebrate without balloons, please dispose of them properly, in the trash, where they don't end up in Mother Nature's domain. And if you are open to alternatives, why not use truly compostable paper decorations instead.
