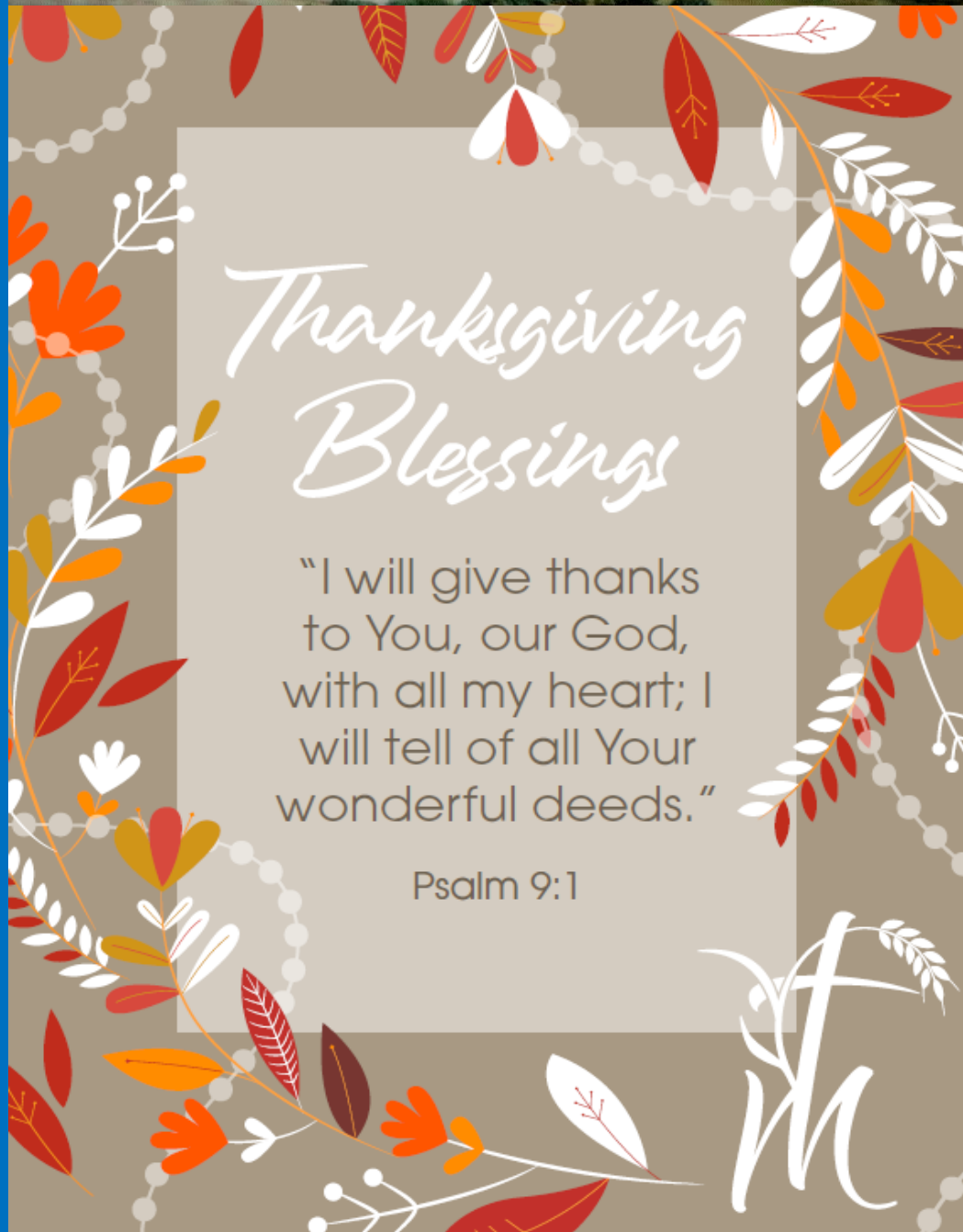

Advent Wreath Candle Lighting Readings for 2022

What is Advent? Advent is the spiritual season, that sacred time when Christians are invited to rest from the hustle of holiday preparations, gift buying, and parties. During Advent, Believers are encouraged to focus on the birth and coming of the Jesus Christ. The word "Advent" has its origin from the Latin term *adventus* which means "arrival" or "coming" which for Christians, refers to the arrival and coming of Jesus Christ.

There are two Advents in the Christian faith, both of which speak of the personal coming of Jesus Christ. The purpose of the First Advent of Christ differs from that of the second in that **the First Advent (Coming)** is purposed to redeem humankind from the penalty of sin from which we could not free ourselves.

¹² Therefore, just as sin entered the world through one man, and death through sin, and in this way death came to all people, because all sinned... ^{20b} But where sin increased, grace increased all the more, ²¹ so that, just as sin reigned in death, so also grace might reign through righteousness to bring eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord.

Romans 5:12, 20b-21 (NIV)

The First Advent (Coming) of Jesus Christ has already taken place to purchase, to "buy us back" from the penalty of sin. The purpose of **the Second Advent of Christ** is not to take away our sin, but to Save all who have lived for and believed in Him.

Christ was sacrificed once to take away the sins of many; and he will appear a second time, not to bear

sin, but to bring salvation to those who are waiting for him.
Hebrews 9:28 (NIV)

Today, we celebrate the First Advent of Christ: **AND** yet, we also await and live for His equally glorious Second Advent.

When is Advent? Advent begins four Sundays prior to Christmas Day. The 2022 BGCVA Advent dates and themes are related to highs and lows of waiting. They are as follow:

1st Sunday

November 27, 2022

The Promise—Isaiah 9:2, 6-7

2nd Sunday

December 4, 2022

The Preparation—Isaiah 40:3-5

3rd Sunday

December 11, 2022

The Peace—Luke 2:10

4th Sunday

December 18, 2022

The Praise—Luke 2:10-20

Christmas Day

December 25, 2022

The Presence—Matthew 2:9-12

HOW TO PREPARE YOUR CHURCH AND FAMILY FOR ADVENT

As a Congregation and Family, many celebrate Advent by incorporating **Advent Wreaths** and **Advent Readings** into their worship services and homes. Advent Wreaths are typically an evergreen wreath containing five candles (two purple candles side by side; followed by a pink candle; and, another purple candle. A large white candle is in the center of the wreath.)

The Advent wreath is usually lit at the beginning of the weekly service with its accompanying Advent reading from the Holy Bible. However, many families

choose to create an Advent wreath and set it on the dinner table or mantel, lighting the candles and using that family time to remind themselves and their children that the Christmas season is first and foremost about Jesus. Other families place the Advent wreath on their mantel. Again, the beauty of this tradition is that you can make it your own, as it suits you and your family.

Your Personal Preparations for Advent are more intimate and private experiences between you and Jesus as your Christ and Savior.

HOW TO PREPARE YOUR PERSONAL "INN" (Your Spiritual House) for ADVENT

1. Examine Your "Inn" for old relationships and situations that contain unforgiveness towards others. The Christian heart (your intentions, motives, and hidden desires) is often filled with emotions that clutter space where Christ desires to be in your life. Advent, for you, begins with you identifying these "unkept" areas in your spirit.

2. Clean Your "Inn": Remove your unwanted "dirt" (un-Christlike ways of living) from your spirit.. Be sure to clean those areas of hurt from your past you have intentionally ignored due to hurt and anger. Purposefully offer forgiveness for the wrongs others have done to you and request forgiveness for the wrongs you have done to others. Remember that the one who may need your forgiveness the most is "YOU".

3. Redecorate Your "Inn": Special guests require special decorations. The décor (emotions) of your old, former life will not do!!! Replace old emotions of hurt, anger, unforgiveness, and indifferences with God's decorations of love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gen-

leness, and self-control (the Fruit of the Holy Spirit).

4. Be Welcoming & Inviting in Your "Inn": Jesus is on His way! He's preparing to knock at the door of your inn. As the host, it is your responsibility to make your Special Guest (Jesus Christ) feel welcomed and invited. How do you do that? By living as Christ lived and obeying His every will and command!



**ADVENT: FIRST SUNDAY -
November 27, 2022
The Promise**

Today is the first Sunday of Advent. We light the first purple candle as we await the Advent, the coming of Jesus, the Christ Child. Come! Let us celebrate the coming of our King!

Advent Scripture: Isaiah 9:2, 6-7
"The people walking in darkness have seen a great light; on those living in the land of deep darkness a light has dawned. [...] For to us a child is born, to us a son is given, and the government will be on his shoulders. And he will be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace. Of the greatness of his government and peace there will be no end. He will reign on David's throne and over his kingdom, establishing and upholding it with justice and righteousness from that time on and forever. The zeal of the Lord Almighty will accomplish this."

Advent Saying:
Who is Jesus, the Christ Child? He

is our Wonderful Counselor, our Mighty God, our Everlasting Father, our Prince of Peace who came to be our Light in our times of darkness. He is our Savior who rules and reigns throughout eternity with justice and righteousness. What is **The Promise?** That "*the zeal of the Lord Almighty will accomplish this.*"

December 4, 2022
The Preparation**

Today, is the second Sunday in Advent. We re-light the first purple candle to commemorate **The Promise** of the coming of Jesus Christ, our Wonderful Counselor, our Mighty God, our Everlasting Father, and our Prince of Peace. Today, we light the second purple candle to remind us of **The Preparation**, our need to prepare our hearts, minds, and souls for the coming of our Lord.

Advent Scripture: Isaiah 40:3-5
"A voice of one calling: 'In the wilderness prepare the way for the Lord; make straight in the desert a highway for our God. Every valley shall be raised up, every mountain and hill made low; the rough ground shall become level, the rugged places a plain. And the glory of the Lord will be revealed, and all people will see it together. For the mouth of the Lord has spoken.'"

Advent Saying:

Advent is much more than just "waiting" for the coming of the Lord. To the Christian, Advent is more importantly about us "preparing" the day when Christ will arrive. If, on the day

when Christ arrives, all we have done is wait with no preparations, we will not have fulfilled the mandate of God to "...prepare the way for the Lord". What is *The Preparation* we are to make? To live as Christ has called us to live so that "...the glory of the Lord will be revealed and all people will see it together."

Advent Selection: Away in a Manger (One Verse)

December 11, 2022
The Peace*

Today, is the third Sunday in Advent. We re-light the first purple candle to commemorate *The Promise* of the coming of Jesus Christ, our Wonderful Counselor, our Mighty God, our Everlasting Father, and our Prince of Peace. We re-light the second purple candle to remind us of *The Preparation*, our need to prepare our hearts, minds, and souls for the coming of our Lord. Today, we light the PINK candle which represents *The Peace* we receive through the birth of Christ.

Advent Scripture: Luke 2:10

¹⁰But the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid. I bring you good news that will cause great joy for all the people." ¹¹Today in the town of David a Savior has been born to you; he is the Messiah, the Lord. ¹²This will be a sign to you: You will find a baby wrapped in cloths and lying in a manger." ¹³Suddenly a great company of the heavenly host appeared with the angel, praising God and

saying, ¹⁴"Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace to those on whom his favor rests."

Advent Saying:

The angel praised God and declared that upon the birth of Jesus Christ, there might be peace on earth. It's part of *The Promise* of God within the Gospel of Jesus Christ that those whom God's favor rests will have *The Peace* of Christ in times when the world is filled with darkness and sin. Let there be Peace on Earth!

Today, we welcome you to the fourth Sunday in Advent. We re-light the first purple candle to commemorate *The Promise* of the coming of Jesus Christ and the second purple candle which represents *The Preparation*, our need to prepare our hearts, minds, and souls for the coming of our Lord. We re-light the pink candle for *The Peace* we receive in the favor of God. Today, we light the final purple candle as we honor God through *The Praise* for sending Christ to save us from our sins.

Advent Scripture: Luke 2:16-20

So they hurried off and found Mary and Joseph, and the baby, who was lying in the manger. When they had seen him, they spread the word con-

cerning what had been told them about this child, and all who heard it were amazed at what the shepherds said to them. But Mary treasured up all these things and pondered them in her heart. The shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all the things they had heard and seen, which were just as they had been told. - Luke 2:16-20

Advent Saying:

Good news is hard to keep to yourself. What greater news has there ever been to the Christian than the birth of Jesus Christ! We've heard *The Promise*. We've endured *The Preparation*. We've experienced *The Peace*. Now, it's time for us to give God *The Praise*. Let us glorify Him Who has wonderfully and marvelously done great things!

This morning is Christmas and we re-light the first purple candle to commemorate *The Promise* of the coming of Jesus Christ and the second which represents *The Preparation*, our need to prepare our hearts, minds, and souls for the coming of our Lord. We re-light the pink candle for *The Peace* we receive in the favor of God and the final purple candle

as we honor God through *The Praise* for sending Christ to save us from our sins. Today, we light the center, white candle – “The Christ Candle” which signifies *The Presence* of Christ in our lives.

Advent Scripture: Matthew 2:9-12

⁹ After the Wise Men had listened to the king, they went on their way. The star they had seen when it rose went ahead of them. It finally stopped over the place where the child was. ¹⁰ When they saw the star, they were filled with joy. ¹¹ The Wise Men went to the house. There they saw the child with his mother Mary. They bowed down and worshiped him. Then they opened their treasures. They gave him gold, frankincense and myrrh. ¹² But God warned them in a dream not to go back to Herod. So they returned to their country on a different road.

Advent Saying:

Christmas morning represents the end of the first Advent, the coming of Jesus Christ, but it symbolically represents the beginning of our continued journey with Christ towards His second coming. The birth of Christ signifies “Immanuel”, *The*

Presence of God with us through the life of Jesus Christ. With the presence of Christ Jesus, we come to Him, we bow down before Him, we worship Him, and we glorify His Name. Some things, you just MUST see for yourself!

Advent Selection: We Three Kings

We three kings of Orient are; Bearing gifts we traverse afar, Field and fountain, moor and mountain, Following yonder star.

O star of wonder, star of light, Star with royal beauty bright, Westward leading, still proceeding, Guide us to thy perfect light.

Executive Minister Greetings

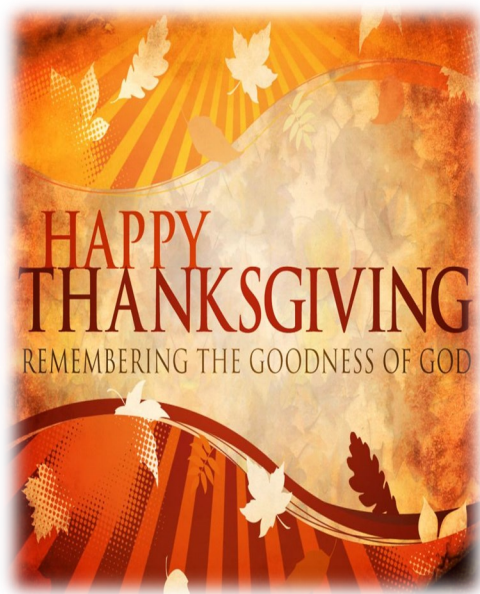

Empowering Healthy Families Research Study

Program for Families with Children in 1st - 5th Grade

The Empowering Healthy Families (EHF) program is recruiting churches for Spring 2023! EHF is hosted in partnership with the Baptist General Convention of Virginia (BGCVA), Virginia Tech, Virginia State University, and Cooperative Extension. We are excited to help families throughout Virginia improve their healthy eating and financial wellness habits. "Open Enrollment" is an opportunity for churches to share their interest to host the program. Once registered with "Open Enrollment," the EHF team will follow-up with additional information. Churches must recruit at least 10 families, a Program Coordinator, and 2 people that will be trained to teach program classes. All positions will receive a stipend for their assistance. Families and the church program team can be recruited from the congregation or the community. Classes are held weekly for 8 weeks. All classes can be hosted virtually (zoom), in-person, or a combination of the two.

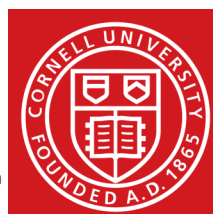

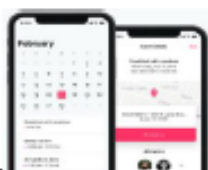
