**SAFETY PRECAUTIONS/CONDITIONS**

- Open-air fires shall not be set unless the following measures are taken to limit their spread:
- Fires must be contained in a non-combustible receptacle constructed of cement, brick or metal.
  - The appliance must be covered with a heavy gauge metal screen with openings not exceeding 13 mm.
  - The fire must be monitored continuously by competent individuals to keep it well under control.
  - A garden hose, extinguisher or other method of extinguishment must be available at all times.

The Town of Springside Fire Department assumes no responsibility for any burning or consequence of any burning. The owner is responsible for any or all damages as a result of burning. The owner may be required to extinguish the fire at any time if it causes unreasonable interference with the use and enjoyment of another person's property.

1. The site of the burning of open-air fires and the receptacles must be inspected and a permit obtained from the authority having jurisdiction.
2. Open air-fires shall not be set unless the following measures are taken to limit their spread:
  - a. Fires must be contained in a non-combustible receptacle constructed of cement, brick or sheet metal with a minimum 18 gauge thickness;
  - b. The receptacle must have a bottom and four sides or 360 degrees round;
  - c. The receptacle's maximum inside measurements shall be 24"x24" or 24" in diameter;
  - d. The receptacle's maximum height/depth shall be 20";
  - e. The top of the receptacle must be completely covered by a grill or screen with openings not exceeding 13mm.
  - f. A fireguard of noncombustible materials 24" wide must surround the receptacle;
  - g. The receptacle must be a minimum of 12' from any building and 20' from the neighbors' buildings, fence and trees;
  - h. The receptacle must be attended to at all times with a water source available.
3. The fuel for open-air fires may consist only of charcoal or cut, seasoned wood. The burning of the following material is prohibited;
  - a. Rubbish;
  - b. Garden refuse;
  - c. Manure;
  - d. Livestock or animal carcasses;
  - e. Any material classified as a dangerous good; and
  - f. Any material which when burned will generate black smoke or an offensive odor including insulation from electrical coring or equipment, asphalt roofing materials, hydrocarbons, plastics, rubber materials, creosoted wood or any similar materials.
4. Open-air fires must not be set in windy conditions conducive to creating a running fire or nuisance to another person.
5. If smoke from an open-air fire causes an unreasonable interference with the use and enjoyment of another person's property, the fire must be extinguished immediately.
6. The permittee is responsible for any or all damages as a result of burning.
7. Anyone violating any section of this bylaw shall be subject to a warning or a fine not exceeding \$100.00.
8. The provisions of this Bylaw shall be administered and enforced by the Fire Chief; or acting Fire Chief in the Chief's absence; who shall also be the Town of Springside " Fire Inspector" and local assistant to the Sask. Fire Commissioner as defined in the Sask. Fire Prevention Act.
