

Texas Persimmons

Diospyros texana

This is a small semi-deciduous tree with dark green leaves. It is often low forking of multi-trunked. In South Texas, Texas Persimmons may retain its leaves throughout the winter. It prefers well drained, alkaline soils. A smooth trunk is one of the most striking characteristics of Texas Persimmons—white, pink, and gray colors show beneath the pealing bark.

Texas Persimmons flowers in March and April. They are white, urn-shaped blooms. Persimmons are diocious

trees. They have small black fruit that ripens in the summer. The fruit tastes like prunes and are relished by birds and mammals alike. Native Americans used the fruit to make black dye for animal hides. This tree is a host plant for the Grey Hairstreak and Henry's Elfin caterpillar.
