Sandra Prince Intermediate Care Program Opens

ACTS held an Open House in mid-September at the revamped and refurbished Sandra Prince Intermediate Care Program. More than 75 people attended the Open House to learn about the program that serves males with mental health and co-occurring substance use with the Hillsborough County Health Care Plan. The program is a 90 – 120 day Level II AHCA Residential Treatment Program with 14 beds available. During the Open House, ACTS CEO Asha Terminello led a brief program, which included speeches from County Commissioner Sandy Murman and ACTS Consultant Pharmacist Rose Ferlita, who spoke about her memories of Sandra Prince. 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Meet Amanda Bush

Recently, ACTS opened an Addictions Receiving Facility on the campus of the Keystone Residential Treatment Program in Tarpon Springs. Amanda Bush is the supervisor of this 10-bed program, which serves Pinellas County and Pasco County residents. Amanda started at ACTS in the Keystone program as a case manager, and transitioned to the receiving facility when it opened its door in August. Clients stay at the program for typically 3 – 5 days, depending on their needs and the substance that they use, said Amanda. One of the first clients at the unit visited several times for treatment, before deciding to move into the residential treatment part of the program
