First Lesson Isaiah 38:1-8, 21-22 [1](#) In those days Hezekiah became sick and was at the point of death. And Isaiah the prophet the son of Amoz came to him, and said to him, "Thus says the LORD: Set your house in order, for you shall die, you shall not recover." [2](#) Then Hezekiah turned his face to the wall and prayed to the LORD, [3](#) and said, "Please, O LORD, remember how I have walked before you in faithfulness and with a whole heart,

and have done what is good in your sight." And Hezekiah wept bitterly. [4](#) Then the word of the LORD came to Isaiah: [5](#) "Go and say to Hezekiah, Thus says the LORD, the God of David your father: I have heard your prayer; I have seen your tears. Behold, I will add fifteen years to your life. [6](#) I will deliver you and this city out of the hand of the king of Assyria, and will defend this city. [7](#) "This shall be the sign to you from the LORD, that the LORD will do this thing that he has promised: [8](#) Behold, I will make the shadow cast by the declining sun on the dial of Ahaz turn back ten steps." So the sun turned back on the dial the ten steps by which it had declined. [21](#) Now Isaiah had said, "Let them take a cake of figs and apply it to the boil, that he may recover." [22](#) Hezekiah also had said, "What is the sign that I shall go up to the house of the LORD?"

Second Lesson Romans 6:1-10 [1](#) What shall we say then? Are we to continue in sin that grace may abound? [2](#) By no means! How can we who died to sin still live in it? [3](#) Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? [4](#) We were buried therefore with him by baptism into death, in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might walk in newness of life. [5](#) For if we have been united with him in a death like his, we shall certainly be united with him in a resurrection like his. [6](#) We know that our old self was crucified with him in order that the body of sin might be brought to nothing, so that we would no longer be enslaved to sin. [7](#) For one who has died has been set free from sin. [8](#) Now if we have died with Christ, we believe that we will also live with him. [9](#) We know that Christ, being raised from the dead, will never die again; death no longer has dominion over him. [10](#) For the death he died he died to sin, once for all, but the life he lives he lives to God.

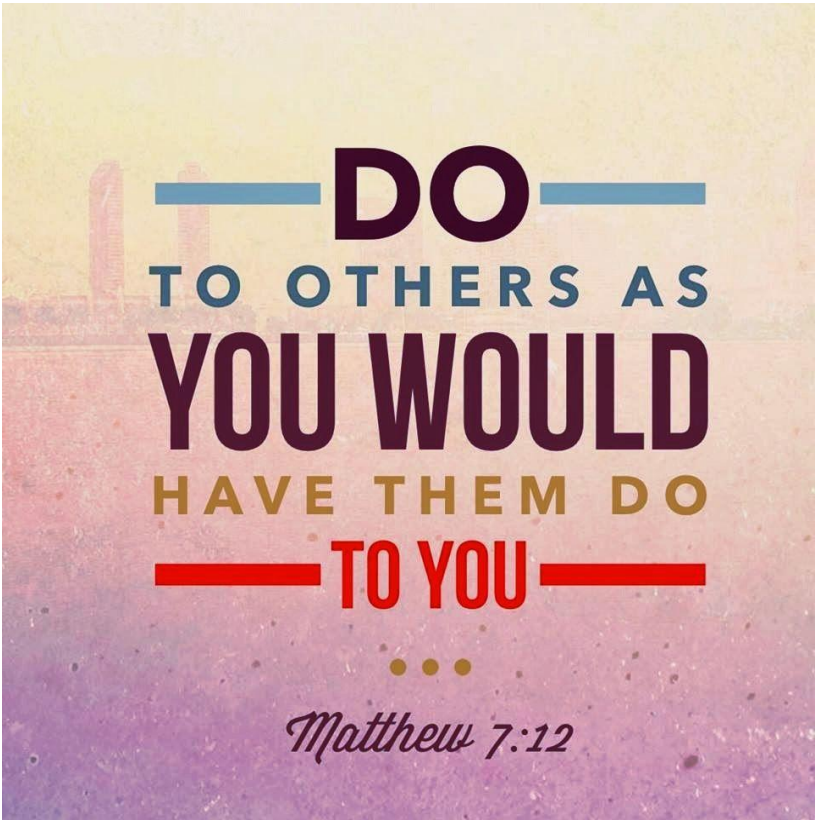
