





ARAB TEMPLE!



Membership Chairman

Just about a year ago I agreed to be the Membership Chairman. At the time I had questions about my ability to turn around the membership decline. To be honest I still have some of the same doubts. I brought together a group of people who helped me identify what we thought needed to be changed to slow the membership decline and in turn hopefully increase our numbers. As I finish my first year I would like to revisit these issues and address the direction membership will go next year. We should start with what we found to be potential issues for membership in Arab Shriners.

The first item the committee felt needed to be addressed was how the building looked inside. The committee talked to a lot of people of which most were Shriners but not all of them. We definitely felt like a year ago, our building was not inviting and needed a modern fresh look. This would be very similar to new carpet and paint as you maintain your home. This led to the hallway project and the completion of the bar renovation, it looks great. This in turn has led to other people stepping up and contributing around our building. Bob Swafford and his volunteers have started painting in the Main room. Steve Haslett and Howard Marlow took the "Fez" down cleaned it and remounted it. The remounted "Fez" is no longer attached through the ceiling tiles by chains so it is a very clean look. I have no idea how much dust and dirt they vacuumed but thank you very much. Now there is further talk about additional improvements around our Shrine Center. Job well done nobles, I appreciate the way everyone came together even as we disagreed, on what was the best solution to the problem.

The next item we identified was the lack of fresh activities for members. The membership committee teamed up with units to bring new events to Arab Shriners. We teamed up with the Arab Patrol and had a comedy night which brought 300 people into our building for about 3 hours. Then we partnered with the Provost Guard and brought a Blues & BBQ event to Arab Shriners. If I recall correctly we fed 200 people and had a good night listening to some great music. These two events made \$2400 and \$1300 which was split by the units and Arab Shriners. As I write this article we have 2 events left. Our Fall Celebration and Dueling Pianos events look to continue the trend of successful fun events for Arab Shriners. I look forward to continue these events and to add a few more in 2015.

The third and possibly one of the most interesting items found lacking was our community presence. The committee felt like we were not visible in the Topeka community. The committee searched for a way to increase our presence in the Topeka community and decided to partner with the Topeka Zoo for 2014. We were a member of the "Herd" advertising all summer at events. Providing volunteers for zoo events including Brew at the Zoo. We also had units at the Zoo the last 2 Saturdays in October handing out candy for the Boo at the Zoo. Also during this time we had a membership table handing out information and answering questions about Shriners. We estimate that 8 new members were found through our participation with the Zoo. Not sure if this partnership will continue but it paid for itself.

The last major obstacle we identified was our relationship with Grand Lodge. We recognized the fact that Arab Shriners needs to create Masons to find Shriners. We also identified few lodges were able to do the work needed to create a Master Mason. I have been told that the number of applicants to receive the mysteries has been down (25%) since the background check requirement was mandated. We also recognized the fact Kansas Masonry has dropped into the 19,000 range and as pointed out in the Kansas Mason 60 lodges are in danger of closing. We also learned early in 2014 that no "One Day Masonic Journey" would be held even after extensive correspondence from me was sent to the Grand Master. Our Illustrious Potentate talked with the Kansas Grand Master and the decision was made to leave things alone. The fact remains we need to find a way to increase our numbers which means we need to create more Master Masons. The Grand Lodge of Kansas is prepared for a smaller more proficient fraternity. My question to you is can we afford one? I am disappointed no progress was made on this topic. I encourage everyone to go back to your lodge and get involved. Help make positive change from the inside. I will be Master of my lodge in 2015 and invite all of you to stop my Mayetta Lodge.

Additional minor things have been going on as well. Membership has started selling shirts, jackets, hats, and blankets. As Roger Farthing points out we need to advertise ourselves and clothing is one easy way to start a conversation. We attempted a trip to the St Louis hospital and it did not make it off of the ground but we are planning to try again in 2015 to the new hospital. We requested every unit and club assign a volunteer to the membership committee. This is still a work in progress but definitely worth trying.

2014 has been a good year and a lot of fun laced with many trials which kept us grounded. I did not think it would be easy but really never expected the disappointments I have experienced either. We truly all want the same thing which is to see Arab Shriners prosper and grow. We know we are headed in the wrong direction and something has to change. Those of you who do not agree with me please answer one question, when was the last time you brought in a new member? If it has been a while please answer another question, why? I ask everyone to ask one person this year to become a Mason and a Shriner. We all know they will have a good time. So where do we go from here...

In 2015 I do not see the membership committee too involved with remodeling projects. We will continue to find ways to have quality events at our Shrine Center. We have a comedy night planned for January 10th to get things started. We will continue to build a committee structure that will bring the clubs and units closer to the membership process as we expand our use of "membership representatives". It takes more than just a few to increase our numbers. Also we hope to have a committee structure that does not have to be rebuilt every time the hat is passed to someone else as I will do at the end of 2015. I look forward to seeing everyone in 2015 thank you for being a Shriner.



Cornerstone Ceremony at St. Louis Hospital

Divan members, Brad Koehn and Jim Whitehead, attended the Cornerstone Ceremony at the new hospital in St. Louis. They were joined by several other Arab Shriners. In the Masonic Cornerstone Ceremony, the stone is checked, using ancient tools, to be certain it's square, plumb, and level because a building constructed on a poor foundation isn't strong. Next, the cornerstone is consecrated with corn, wine, and oil - all of which are Masonic symbols of prosperity, health, and peace. Finally, the stone is symbolically tapped in place with a gavel. Imperial Potentate Dale Stauss, Deputy Imperial Potentate Jerry Gantt, and National Patient Ambassador Katy Ladlie were in attendance. Following the ceremony, hospital tours were provided.





On July 12 Leonard Dale and Chuck Loeffler displayed their cars at Brew at the Zoo and several members attended.




July 19th the Antiques sponsored the Hors d'ocuvres at the Shrine lounge. There was a big turn out and we had a great evening.






