

#### **Relatives Pay Respects to Strasburg WWI Veteran in France**

Monday, May 26, marked the Strasburg Lions Leo Club Memorial Day Celebration. A crowd of nearly 100 attended and listened to speaker Tawn Tipsword of Beecher City share his experiences aboard submarines as a Master Chief Petty Officer in the U.S. Navy.

During the Memorial Day ceremony, LEO Kendra Hayes shared the story of Henry C. Lading of Strasburg who was killed by a submarine attack on an American troop ship in 1918 during WWI. Lading is memorialized at Suresnes America Cemetery near Paris France.

A week before the Memorial Day Celebration in Strasburg, Gary and Karen

Kull of Strasburg and Dennis and Nitelle Lading of Effingham were in France and visited the Suresnes memorial site where Henry Lading is memorialized. Karen and Dennis are distant relatives of the WWI veteran.

When they visited on May 20, the well-kept American cemetery was being prepared and prepped for celebration of Memorial Day. Markers were being scrubbed and grounds tidied by the staff. Kulls and Ladings discovered the bronze tablet in the chancel area of the memorial which lists Henry C. Lading's name. A poppy bouquet made by the





Strasburg American Legion Auxiliary was left at the site.

The Suresnes Cemetery is maintained by the American Battle Monuments Commission which operates and maintains 26 American Cemeteries in 17 countries. The cemetery and memorial

at Suresnes was granted by France for perpetual use free of charge or taxation.

The cemetery is located on a hill near Paris with the Eiffel Tower visible in the distance. It was a fitting spot to note the life and death of a former resident of Strasburg who gave his life in service to our country.


Saturday, July 12th @ 11:30am

#### **WSS High School Bass Team** reels in the win







- Serve as role models by inspiring others to serve

A letter of nomination citing the points or reasons the nominator feels like the candidate deserves to be named Volunteer of the Year should be submitted to the Strasburg Village Office prior to August 15, 2025. A committee will review the nominations and will select the winner. The Volunteer of the Year award for 2025 will be presented at the Village Wiener Roast on Friday, September 19th at Village Park.
