Stephan Pyles, a 5th generation Texan and founding father of Southwestern Cuisine, is a celebrated chef, cookbook author, philanthropist, and educator. He has created 23 restaurants in 6 cities over the past 32 years, including Routh Street Café, Baby Routh, Star Canyon, Stephan Pyles, Samar, Stampede 66 and Flora Street Café.


Pyles was the first person in the Southwest to win the James Beard Award for Best Chef and was the first Texan inducted into The Beard Foundation's Who's Who of Food and Wine in America. In addition to his wins, Chef Pyles has been nominated another 12 times by the Beard Foundation for Outstanding Chef in America and has had 6 restaurants that were finalists for Best New Restaurant in America.

In January of this year, Chef Pyles transitioned from restaurant ownership and operations to consulting, License Agreements and organizing culinary tours around the world. "This will give me the time, finally, to document my experiences in serving the city's famous and infamous, as well as cooking for the likes of Mick Jagger, Madonna and Cher, and of course a host of American Presidents and First Ladies."

A tireless philanthropist, Pyles is a founding board member of Share Our Strength, America's largest hunger relief organization and is a recipient of the organization's Humanitarian of the Year Award for his work with their No Kid Hungry Campaign. He is a life board member of the North Texas Food Bank and has served on the board of Goodwill Industries and The Art Institute. He co-founded The Hunger Link, Dallas' perishable food program that acts as a conduit between restaurants and hotels and ministries and soup kitchens. Through his Stephan Pyles Culinary Scholarship, he has awarded \$250,000 to culinary students in Texas.

She produced and executive produced documentaries and specials on a wide range of social, political and cultural issues. Among her national public television credits as program executive are The U.S.- Mexican War (1846-1848), Sweet Tornado: Margo Jones and the American Theater, JFK: Breaking the News, Matisse & Picasso, For A Deaf Son and After Goodbye: An AIDS Story.

Sylvia is a graduate of Harvard University and the Columbia University Graduate School of Journalism. Sylvia and her husband, George, live in Dallas.

Chris Lawrence co-anchors the 5, 6 & 10pm newscasts at WFAA. Before coming to Dallas with his wife and three children, Chris worked at various local stations and spent 13 years at CNN and CBS News.

He was one of the few reporters who stayed in New Orleans after the levees broke, bringing firsthand coverage of the aftermath of Hurricane Katrina. He reported live from Haiti within hours of the devastating earthquake in 2010.



Chris spent ten years going back and forth to Iraq and Afghanistan, covering the wars and the impact on American troops. He also reported from Israel and Pakistan, and was CNN's Pentagon correspondent.

Chris is a veteran of the Navy Reserve, and graduated from the University of Maryland College Park. He enjoys traveling, running marathons and rare quiet time with a good book. Since moving to Dallas he's become actively involved in "Carry the Load," an organization dedicated to sharing the stories of servicemembers who gave their lives in service to their country.

While in Miami, Nelda was the manager of the bookstores at Miami Dade Community College with a student population of 50,000. She was active in forming a status of women group working to promote equal pay and opportunities for women trying to advance in their careers. Nelda was President of her Temple Sisterhood and a board member of several organizations.

Nelda and Stan relocated to Dallas in 1980. She opened a business providing temporary personnel for corporations and businesses. After a few years she sold the company and became an personal consultant, providing support in hiring, developing job descriptions and other personnel matters.

Nelda is a founding member of SWJC, serving as a board member and as Program Vice President. She founded a Couples Club at Temple Emanu-El for middle-aged couples which provided social events and friendship. Nelda started an organization (still active today) called the Association of Women Executives (AWE) comprised of professional women in various careers for networking and contributing to groups that they can assist.

Nelda said, "I have had a life of activity both in work and family, and dedication to helping others. This has brought me personal satisfaction, friendships and happiness." Wherever she has been present, Nelda's great sense of humor and affability have created long-lasting bonds of friendship and respect.

Hank Alterman was born in San Antonio and grew up in Dallas. He was part of a successful law practice for 46 years.

In July, 1999, an important event occurred. Hank stopped for breakfast at a local diner before meeting a client. While chatting with his waiter, he learned that the young man wanted to attend college but simply did not have the funds for tuition. Hank wished he could do something for him besides leaving a generous tip!

Hank could not get that young man out of his thoughts. A year later, The Scholarship Fund, a nonprofit 50I(c)(3) corporation was born! Hank turned to everyone he knew-family, friends, clients-and asked for contributions. He was asking people to join in the most important investment they could ever make in their community: the education of young people.

Over the past 20+ years, this modestly staffed organization of volunteers has raised more than \$713,300 (and counting) to benefit 73 Dallas-area students. With this help, and along with their own dedication and diligence, these students have gone on to become engineers, healthcare workers, social workers, teachers, policy makers, attorneys and more.

A recent medical diagnosis necessitated that Hank retire from his law practice and consider the future of The Scholarship Fund. He thought he would have to liquidate the organization, but fortunately, a Dallas philanthropist, broadcast journalist and author Scott Murray assumed leadership of The Scholarship Fund, which is now doing business as the Scott Murray Scholarship Fund. With Scott's leadership, the non-profit is in a position to expand the scope and reach of the mission well into the future.


Dale Hansen, originally from Logan, Iowa, never went to college. After high school, Dale served in the US Navy during the Vietnam War. In 1980, Dale took his first job in Dallas at KDFW, which at the time was CBS's Dallas affiliate. He later left KDFW and joined WFAA.

Starting in 1983, Dale had a segment during "Sports Special" on the Sunday of the week before Christmas. He would select a story about a child's death from the past year and discuss it. Dale used the segment in 2011 to disclose that he was a victim of sexual abuse as a child, in hopes that it would convince other survivors to come forward.

Hansen made his reputation in 1986 when he and his producer, John Sparks, broke a story about a scandal involving payments to players on SMU's football team. His reporting earned him a Peabody Award for distinguished journalism, a DuPont-Columbia Award, and several death threats.

Dale became famous in recent years when his commentaries, Unplugged, which touched on matters such as racism and domestic violence were circulated and widely viewed on YouTube. Dale officially retired on September 2, 2021.

Dale has had 11 jobs in his professional life (and was fired from nine of them). He and his wife, Chris, first met when she used her broadcasting degree behind the scenes, running cameras at the studio where they both worked. Dale and Chris just celebrated their 40th Anniversary and live on their miniranch in Waxahachie with their 21 animals.


Louis battled addiction for 20 years and has experienced the transforming power of the gospel of Jesus Christ, assisted by the Men of Nehemiah (MON), a program founded by his father in New Orleans in 1994.

In February 2010, Louis and a core team of inspired individuals followed the call to establish the MON in South Dallas to help men suffering from drug and alcohol addiction. In its first year, the MON housed three men. Today, the ministry has served over 1,000 men and their families through restoration and transformation using Biblical discipleship, clinical treatment, and military-style leadership training.

In 2019, Louis was selected as an honoree of the Each Moment Matters Luncheon for exhibiting faith and devotion to serving others in the community. He currently serves as the CEO & Executive Director of the Men of Nehemiah, along with a team of dedicated staff.

Louis followed in the footsteps of his dad, hoping to rebuild the lives of families that have been torn apart by poverty, homelessness, incarceration, substance abuse, crime, and violence. His tools have included a traveling male chorus, family counseling, mentorship, job training readiness, case management, computer literacy training and other faith-based support services.

Louis, born in France, lives in Dallas with his wife Denise. They have two daughters, Lucretia, and Shant'e, who live in the metroplex and are both healthcare specialists.


Dr. Harbans Lal was born in Haripur, India. He came to the United States in 1956 as a student and married Amrita in 1964 in Chicago. He has three children and a granddaughter.

Harbans has always devoted his energies to inter-religious engagement for mutual understanding and serving civil societies' needs. Following 9/11, after attacks on Sikhs by civilians, he counseled law enforcement on police interaction with Sikhs and other ethnic Americans.

Harbans has represented the Sikh community on the Interfaith Council of Thanks-Giving Square for over 25 years. His services are recognized by Buddhist, Hindu, Islamic, and Judeo-Christian institutions. He is co-editor of J. Sikhism and Comparative Religion, Nishaan, and the Sikh Review. He publishes two blogs, Seeking Wisdom and Tapestry of Memories.

Dr. Lal has served as Professor and Chairman, Department of Pharmacology-Neuroscience, University of North Texas Health Science Center, and Former Editor-in-Chief of Monthly Journal, Drug Development Research. He was President of the Association of the Scientists of Indian Origin in America and a member of many national and international organizations serving science, religion, media, and civil societies.

During his career, he published over 1000 scholarly papers and 30 books. Guru Nanak Dev University recognized his works with a Doctor of Literature (honoris causa) degree and the Anandpur Sahib Foundation by Order of Nishan-e-Khalsa. American College of Neuropsychopharmacology included him in the Archives of Medical Discoveries, and the Society of Neuroscience conferred him the Outstanding Neuroscientist Award. He served on many US and international Science advisory boards, including Study Sections of the National Institutes of Health, the National Science Foundation, and the US Food and Drug Administration.

Richard Miles was born in Dallas and went to Skyline High School. At the age of 19, he was wrongly arrested and sentenced to 60 years for murder and aggravated assault. In 2007, an innocence organization accepted Richard's case and was released October 12, 2009.


On February 15, 2012, the Court of Criminal Appeals ruled unanimously and granted him Actual Innocence. (Ex Parte Richard Miles (359 SW 3rd 647). The ruling included compensation for Richard under Texas law.

In June of 2012, Richard made an initial seed investment to start Miles of Freedom. "Miles" is the acronym for (Motivating Inspiring Law-abiding Enthusiastic Successful). The mission of Miles of Freedom is to provide holistic support for individuals, families and communities impacted by incarceration.

Richard's story has been featured on the Larry King Show, TV One documentary and multiple news/media outlets. In 2019, Richard Miles shared the international stage as one of the Top 10 CNN Hero's.

Most importantly, the State Legislature recognized the importance of enacting changes to avoid a similar miscarriage of justice. On September 1, 2021, the Richard Miles Act was passed in Texas. This law addresses the accountability and timely disclosure of evidence as it relates to arresting officer/agencies. Richard is enrolled at Paul Quinn College working on his bachelor's in business administration. He serves on the boards of God's Holy Church of Christ, Dallas Sheriff Community Partnership, Centurion Innocence Organization and Power in Action.

Richard's life is now filled with his faith in God, family support, wife Latoya Miles and two beautiful daughters Raelyn and Aubreigh Miles. Richard's future seems to have many more "miles of freedom". For more information about Miles of Freedom visit www.milesoffreedom.org.

Fernando "Monty" Moncibais was born in San Antonio. He is now Senior Corporal Moncibais, badge 3162. Monty was hired by the Dallas Police Department in 1971 as one of the first handful of Hispanics to serve the City of Dallas. He is only one of two Dallas Officers who have served for fifty years or more. Monty is married to Susan and lives in Heath, Texas.

Monty started in Patrol where he trained rookie Officers, worked as a Detective in crimes against property, crimes against persons, homicide, narcotics, identification, and the polygraph unit. He has received over 110 commendations including an award in 1992 for saving a man who was threatening suicide 30 feet over a major freeway.

He created the "Stage Right" Program with the Broadway Dallas (f/k/a Dallas Summer Musicals); this meant students saying no to drugs and alcohol, committing no crimes, doing well in school, honoring one's family, along with an appreciation for the cultural arts. The program was very successful with over 600 students attending a musical each year.

Monty spent nine years in the Police Community Relations unit and gave hundreds of presentations to schools, community groups, faith-based organizations and private institutions. He helped expand the role of police in the "Special Olympic Torch Run" from Dallas only to state wide participation.

As the Narcotics Outreach Detective he coordinated and organized the largest "Red Ribbon Campaign" ever held. He was instrumental in developing a drug prevention and child safety initiative around deadly "Cheese" (Black Tar Heroin). The initiative involved the Dallas Police, FBI, DEA, DISD and City of Dallas. This coalition successfully reached the entire DISD school population.





Noa's biggest motivations and inspirations are her mom, Eve Ksabi, and older sister, Mica Glaun: two self-made women who embody the drive and courage that it takes to succeed. Out of all her high school initiatives, Noa is most proud of her organization, the Jewish Medical Action and Awareness Club (JMAAC) that has led her to inviting national speakers, such as Diane Shader Smith, to her school and that led her to authoring and illustrating a children's book ("Lungs of Gold") that was later donated and distributed to hospitals across the country. Written during the pandemic and about Cystic Fibrosis, a genetic disease prevalent in Jewish people and specifically the disease which Diane Ms. Smith raised awareness about when speaking at AYA.

A student athlete with a gentle nature and fierce determination, Noa stays fully involved, always busy and full of wonder and passion for doing good in the world. She is mature in her outlook on life, and employs a solid work ethic as she energetically solves problems of the day. Both her father, Moshe, and her mom were born in Israel; they have been constant supporters of all of Noa's ambitions.

Spencer Jackson Burke, born in Dallas, graduated from St. Mark's School of Texas and is currently majoring in Electrical and Computer Engineering/Plan II Honors at UT Austin. At St. Mark's, he played in the Concert and Studio Jazz Bands, and served as Triumvirate (President) of the Classics Club, President of Chess for Humanity, and Captain of both the Rocketry Club and Varsity Fencing Team.

Spencer is an Eagle Scout with 23 Palms and earned all 140 Merit Badges (less than 25 Scouts since 1910 have ever achieved this maximum rank combination). He was elected Senior Patrol Leader and is a Brotherhood Order of the Arrow member. Spencer earned the Thomas Edison Silver Supernova Medal (Scouts BSA's highest STEM recognition), and is the 2021 & 2022 "Texas Eagle Scout of the Year."

Annually volunteering more than 250+ hours each year, Spencer particularly focuses on developing engineering solutions to environmental problems. To address the declining solitary bee population, he led four large multi-year conservation projects to remove invasive species, plant native grasses/wildflowers, reintroduce quail in the Blackland Prairie, and design, construct, and install 100 solitary bee nesting boxes across Dallas nature preserves. He also led several native wildflower service projects as Trail Captain of the Northaven Trail. For his efforts, Spencer received the Texas Environmental Excellence Award by the State of Texas, the BSA Hornaday Silver Medal, the Points of Light Service Award by late President George H.W. Bush's Foundation, the Daughters of American Revolution Conservation Award and was recently honored by President Biden with the President's Environmental Youth Award.

In his spare time, Spencer enjoys blacksmithing, reading mythology, and playing chess. His parents, Nancy and Darryl, live in Dallas.




