


He came to Kelleys Island some time between 1871 and 1874 where he worked as a blacksmith. In 1886 he built this house on fashionable Water Street so it is evident that he prospered. Henry Scheele, Bavarian emigrant who is said to have been brought to the island as a winemaker for the Kelley Island Wine Co.

It is known that he emigrated in 1874 at age 16, and was on Kelleys Island by 1880, boarding with winery worker, Henry Bauer, but working as a quarryman. By 1900, however, he was listed as a wine agent for the Becker Winery (ER-360), and in 1882 had married Caroline, daughter of William Becker, Sr., his employer. At the time he purchased this house he had advanced to Sales Agent for Becker.

His son, Arnold, born on Kelleys Island 1886, continued to live in the house until his death in 1973. Arnold Scheele was a well known Ohio artist especially recognized for his sea scapes. He taught art at the University of Illinois, and for 26 years, at Michigan State.
