So, I'm feeling somewhat rejuvenated and ready to have at things as we move into late summer and early fall. And here's what I'm having at ...

- We are going to continue to hold in-person worship services on Sunday mornings, keeping the groups small, masked, and physically distant;
- We are going to resume Holy Communion starting August 2nd;
- Because there is no semblance of a coordinated national strategy of prevention and care, this pandemic is not only persisting but roaring along. And because of that we are also going to offer Holy Communion to those of you choosing to worship from afar. We will do communion through the Internet. More on that in a separate email. Do know that we have been thinking this through very carefully, consulting with clergy colleagues, bishops, and public health experts;
- We are also looking at expanding our online worship times. Currently, we are considering Sunday and Wednesday evenings, with study and worship. We are also thinking about a weekday afternoon book club. For now, these will all be via Zoom;
- Finally, in terms of subject matter we are considering a study on racism and the Church; an Epistle of the New Testament, or a book with a religious topic there are already a couple of good books on faith and the COVID19 pandemic.

So, if you have any particular thoughts on these matters, do let me know. My aim is to start in mid/late August.

Remember - We're in this together. And God goes with us.

How to Donate

At checkout, present your Maika'i card (or provide your number) and inform the cashier that you would like to make a donation to **Christ Lutheran Church**, code number **77769**. If you do not have a Maika'i card/number, you may request to establish one. Your donation will be added to your grocery purchase total. You may donate up to \$249 per organization; any portion exceeding \$249 will not be matched. The amount you donate and the name of our organization will appear on your receipt. Donations must be payable to Foodland or Sack N Save.

Acknowledgement of Your Donation

Donor names will not be released to our organization. Therefore, if you would like to us to know of your gift, please contact us directly so that we may properly acknowledge your gift. You may ask the cashier for a duplicate receipt to submit to us.

Are These Contributions Tax Deductible?

These contributions are tax deductible to the fullest extent of the law. Please save your store receipt for tax purposes since it will be the only record you will have of your donation(s).

Matching Gift

Matching gifts will be determined at the end of the program. Our organization will receive 100% of all customer donations given to us, plus each donation made with a Maika'i card, will be partially matched by a gift from Foodland and the Western Union Foundation.
