## SAFETY POLICIES AT THE STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS

Ohio 7th-12th Grade State Singles Championships Sat. June 27, 2020 & State Doubles Championships Sun. June 28, 2020

Bowlers & Spectators:

As a condition to operate the 7th-12th Grade State Singles and State Doubles Championships, we must be in compliance with the State of Ohio General Non-Contact Sports mandates and the operation policies of Wayne Webb's Columbus Bowl. Below, please find the attendance policies at these State Championships.

### BOWLERS

1. **"NO-TOUCH" RULE IS IN EFFECT:** All individuals must avoid physical contact with others before, during and after the event in the facility. This includes high-fives, handshakes, hugs, fist bumps, etc.
2. **EQUIPMENT:** Equipment (balls, shoes, towels, accessories items, including beverages and food, etc.) may not be shared with anyone. Only touch and use your own personal equipment.
3. **MAXIMUM PARTICIPANTS:** Per bowling center policy, the maximum number of bowlers is 138 for the Saturday Singles Championships and 69 teams (138 bowlers) for each shift of the Sunday Doubles Championships.
4. **LANE ASSIGNMENTS:** To significantly reduce bowler and spectator movement in the bowling center, Bowlers will bowl all 5 games of the Qualifying Round in the Singles Championships and all 10 games in the Doubles Championships on the same pair of lanes. Lanes will be arbitrarily pre-assigned by Tournament Management.

### SPECTATORS

1. **SOCIAL DISTANCING:** Spectators must maintain six-foot social distancing. **To assist in compliance with this regulation, only one (1) spectator per bowler (and only when accompanied by the bowler at entry) will be permitted in the bowling center.** Spectators must wear supplied wristbands while in attendance.

### BOWLERS AND SPECTATORS

1. **FACE MASKS:** Face masks are allowed for bowlers and are **STRONGLY** encouraged for spectators. 3-ply disposable face masks will be available for sale in the tournament office for \$1.00.
2. **SYMPTOMS:** Anyone experiencing symptoms of illness will not be admitted into the bowling center. Anyone experiencing illness symptoms must stay home. The center will take a mandatory no-touch temperature reading of all athletes and spectators at entry. Anyone with a fever will not be admitted.
2. **SANITATION:** Hands should be sanitized on a regular basis either with soap and water (20 sec.) or with hand sanitizer located throughout the center and in the tournament office at no charge.

### NOTICES

The State of Ohio can amend their mandates of bowling center operation at will and without notice. We must comply with their changing mandates as a condition to conduct these State Championships and to operate the bowling center. **Any additional or revised State mandates will be announced on-site.** Please exercise sound judgement and respect all safety rules for everyone's benefit.
