


FROUT COMMITTEE


WE DID IT! Another successful IWLA Trout Season...and we couldn't have

The turn-out of additional volunteers for releasing the trout exceeded our expectations. This strong IWLA member support provided shorter working hours for the trout-crew, faster release for the trout and a fun learning experience for young & old(er) volunteers. The 2020-21 season ends in May and the final clean-up of the nursery completes our spring activities. Mark your calendars now for the 2021-22 Trout season, starting up late October. Hopefully, we won't have Covid restrictions, allowing for normal trout activities then. Jerry and I look forward to seeing the familiar faces from this Spring, and to welcoming new member-volunteers to help raise a new hover of juvenile trout. BUILDING & GROUNDS

We will have another work day Sunday, May 23rd from 1:00 pm until 4:00 pm. When attending these work details always wear old clothes, boots and gloves. Bring saws, rakes and other similar implements to these first two work details. Trucks and trailers for moving brush and wood are a plus too. We will focusing on spring cleanup of the grounds May to include trimming along the driveway and edges of the woods for mowing etc.



York Water, HRG, Ecotone, and Izaak Walton League volunteered their time to help pick up trash along the East Branch of the Codorus Creek May 1st. The event was a great success with three full pick-up loads of trash being removed from the area between Log Rd and Iron Stone Hill Rd! This not only benefits the aesthetics of the area, but helps improve the habitat and reduce pollution. Some notable items found include: approximately 20 tires, an entire port-a-potty (stuck since 2011!), parts of a picnic table, a traffic barrel, and the entire front end bumper of a car! We are very thankful to all of the volunteers for helping improve and protect our source water, and look forward to next year's event!

Time to dust off your fishing equipment (if you haven't already done so). The largemouth bass have been in the shallows, on beds, for the last three(3) weeks. The beds are very prominent as plate sized circles of white, clean rock. Fish are being caught using small crankbaits and grub style (Twister tails for those of us who are older) jigs. There has been a very consistent topwater bite that lasts about an hour just before dusk. Remember to release any bass 13" or larger back into the pond. We are seeing an increase in the 13-15" fish this year. The panfish have moved into the mid to upper water column. The males are beginning to darken in color and the females are egg laden, so in a few more weeks they will be found on the flats tending to their spawning beds. These fish are being caught with small jigs presented with a slow, steady retrieve and on

small crankbaits (1.5-2" lures). Panfish will continue to be under the catch and release management plan. There are currently four(4) tagged fish in the pond. The tags are brown and cylindrical in shape, found in the dorsal fin area. Any tagged fish are of the size/type that are to be released back into the pond. If you do catch a tagged fish, please note what area of the pond it was caught in and the length of the fish (preferably no guessing on the length), and contact Greg Zeigler (717-578-1718 or zigsjigs@comcast.net) with the info. Pictures are always a great bonus and greatly appreciated if they can be taken. There may be a bounty prize to go with your catch as well! Remember, it's warmer outside so the other pond residents will be out and about more frequently. Toads, birds, snakes, etc. are not unusual sightings around the water. As always, enjoy your time at the pond!
