
While some study groups are now full, there are many still available and welcoming new participants! A few highlights:



AZ AUTHORS November 17th 12:30 - 2:30 - At the JCC Author/speaker is Alexandra Kinias.

Alexandra Kinias was born in Egypt and educated in Egypt and the United States. She is the co-author of the Egyptian movie *Cairo Exit*. Her book, *Black Tulips*, is the story of four Egyptian women who, although they come from very diverse social and economic backgrounds, face a common adversary - a male dominant society. The lives of the four women unfold in a backdrop of a political thriller that takes the reader from the Nile and the deserts of Egypt to the treacherous snow-capped mountains of Afghanistan, the terrorist training camps of Pakistan, and the American capital. Corruption, deceit, devotion, love and

revenge drive the characters of this novel to a memorable journey of survival and liberation. Culturally informative, trendsetting, provocative, and taboo shattering, this story is an ode to human and, especially, women's equality. Black Tulips reflects Alexandra's experience as a woman growing up in Egypt. She also writes for Kalimat Magazine and her blog Silenced Voices.... Ms. Miller received her Master of Music degree in Vocal Performance from The Florida State University and is currently pursuing her Doctor of Musical Arts degree in Vocal Performance at Arizona State University. Her performance and concert credits include the title roles in opera companies and concert choral groups around the country.

Jeremy Peterman

Jeremy Peterman, organist and pianist, is active in the Valley as both a performer and vocal coach. He earned undergraduate degrees in French and Piano Performance from the University of North Carolina



at Chapel Hill, as well as a Master of Music degree and a Doctor of Musical Arts degree in Collaborative Piano from Arizona State University. In the community, Jeremy has worked for several years with Arizona Opera and its OperaTunity education program. He was Arizona Opera's staff pianist for their productions since the 2011-2012 season. He has been a staff pianist at the American Institute of Musical Studies (AIMS) in Graz, Austria every summer since 2005, where he is now the director of the AIMS staff pianists. Also as the AIMS organist and director of church music since 2005, he performs throughout the summer in many churches in and around Graz with singers. Locally, he is the organist and associate director of worship at King of Glory in Tempe, the pianist for Chandler Children's Choir and Phoenix Women's Chorus, and the Director of Choral Activities at Arizona Christian University.



News from Brandeis

Our world-renowned Brandeis scientists continue to publish new and exciting research every few weeks. During the spring semester alone, Dr. Suzanne Paradis discovered a new molecule that could help explain how neurons grow, and Drs. Dagmar Ringe and Gregory Petsko began testing a promising new treatment for Alzheimer's disease at the cellular level. These successes are small pieces of the puzzle towards curing neurodegenerative diseases; however, the tenacity of our researchers and the support of the Sustaining the Mind campaign provides hope for our aging population.

Of course, Eve Marder continues to be our all-star professor of neuroscience and world-renowned scientist in this field. She received the Gruber Prize last year and is one of 14 scientists in the U.S. to be part of

the President's "BRAIN" trust. She was also elected to the National Academy of Sciences.

Did you know that Brandeis does research for ALS? Instead of pouring icy water on your head, you can make that check out to our Sustaining the Mind campaign! ALS is one of the many neurodegenerative diseases that our Brandeis researches are working on (See article in October Beat)

Recently Gina Turrigiano, professor of neuroscience, was named one of the 30 most influential neuroscientists alive today. Gina Turrigiano is the author of numerous papers, has been awarded a MacArthur Foundation Genius grant and the HFSP Nakasone Award, and in 2013 was elected to the very auspicious National Academy of Sciences. The NSA is the highest achievement for a scientist. Her research includes

brain disorders such as epilepsy and autism spectrum disorders. So what makes Brandeis so vital and important to the neuroscience field? We study the brain because before you begin to think about how to treat a neurodegenerative disease, you need to understand the processes that you are treating, and that's where Brandeis excels, because there is so much interactive science taking place. You can't develop a drug until you understand what the drug is targeting and Brandeis provides a huge and necessary service to a global endeavor for understanding and curing neurodegenerative diseases.




