Pastoral Reflection

Thanksgiving is one of those holidays that create core memories in our childhood. My family was small and so I have great memories of my mom bringing out the really good china and spending all morning, and much of the day before, preparing the food and making sure that everything was "just so." Because my mother was German, our meal was a mix of traditional American food, with some tasty German treats as well. My dad always insisted on mince meat pie, but he was the only one who ate it, with the rest of us turning up our noses at the strange smelling and looking New England dish. When we were young, we had to put on our best clothes for the meal and we were on our best behavior around a splendidly decorated table. Even with all that, there was laughter, conversation, and a deep sense of belonging. Everything was designed to provide a unique experience and to encourage an attitude of gratitude. As we got older, the dress code and formality relaxed, but there was still a sense of specialness that added to the spirit of giving thanks.

In the years since, I've been to different homes for Thanksgiving. The first time was with a family with 11 adult children, a whole bunch of grand and great grandchildren. The meal was buffet style and you sat wherever you could find a spot. Very different from my experience, but just as wonderful. The spirit of thankfulness pervaded the chaos and joyfulness of such a large family. Another time, I was with a family where everyone had to say something for which they were thankful as part of the pre-meal prayer. We never did that in my family, but I thought it was a neat tradition, although there was that one person who went on and on about their gratitude, while the rest were ready to dive in to the delicious meal that was waiting for us.

The last few years Thanksgiving was just my father and me. I would bring the food to his house on Thanksgiving. Inevitably he would forget and already have eaten lunch, but he still made an effort, and he was always so grateful. Those quiet Thanksgivings of just the two of us were just as meaningful as those of my childhood. Thanksgiving had come full circle.

My point in all this is to remind us that no matter how we celebrate Thanksgiving, it is the connections that we make with one another that create the opportunity for gratitude. Of course, not everything in our lives inspires gratitude. Difficulties and even tragedy is part of the fabric of life; at times it is hard to be thankful. Thanksgiving is an opportunity to recall the blessings God has given us. The holiday reminds us that if we look deeply, we will find God in every situation, and for that we can be thankful. I am thankful for all of you and thankful that God has placed me here with you, in this wonderful parish. God bless you and Happy Thanksgiving!





Introduction to the Liturgy of the Word

- 2 Samuel 5:1–3 The shepherd David is anointed king.
- Psalm 122 "Let us go rejoicing to the house of the Lord."
- Colossians 1:12–20 God has made us worthy to share the lot of the saints in light.
- Luke 23:35–43 "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom."

Our first reading today takes us back to when the elders of the twelve tribes of Israel anointed David king. In the second reading we hear an early church prayer, extolling Jesus in words like the ones we recite today in the creed. The Gospel offers two very different ways in which the men condemned with Jesus viewed the inscription on his cross. In harmony with the good thief, may we sing out in today's responsorial psalm, "Let us go rejoicing to the house of the Lord."
