Angels Among Us has a very simple mission: they supply comfort, hope and support to families fighting pediatric cancer. When a cancer diagnosis is delivered to a child the entire family is greatly impacted. This 501C3 organization was created in 2006 by two mother's to help with financial difficulty for Nebraska families with childhood cancer.

Mom and dad may miss work for the child's treatment, travel must be worked out, babysitters needed for siblings and bills still need to be paid, these are some financial areas of help for families. This money is for any child and family treated at the Nebraska Hospital. The average is about \$500.00 per month for 9 to 18 months.

This emotional and financial support is for children 18 months through 19 years. There are many methods of support as we noted on our day of visiting, they were preparing for a child and family movie night complete with popcorn and snacks. All to make life a bit more normal for a brief while.

Formerly Ted E Bear Hollow the name was changed in 2017 to reflect the groups expanded programs to teens and adults as well as children and increased professional training. Their mission is to provide excellent compassionate grief support, services, education and professional training so that all are able to experience and express their grief in their own way.

Support groups include eight sessions - family, monthly family, Adults Helping Adults, Camp Hope/Teen Camps, Serious Illness/Injury Support Groups as well as their Children Groups. All peer support groups are free. In addition they provide grief training and consultation to schools and other organizations. If selected as Metro Women's Club 2019-2020 charity, they would use the money for an upcoming building campaign to house the combined Grief's Journey and Healing Embrace organization.

POLICE ATHLETICS FOR COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT (P.A.C.E.)

The primary goal is to build stronger relationships between neighborhoods and the Police Officers that patrol those communities. At a time of "pay to play" athletics, inner city and at-risk youth are left out of these character building activities. P.A.C.E is dedicated to offering athletic opportunities to at-risk youth free of charge. No one is turned away.

P.A.C.E. programs combine community policing, crime prevention, youth development and education via team sports. Core values are 'R.E.S.P.E.C.T' (Reliability, Enthusiasm, Sportsmanship, Positive Attitude, Education, Commitment and Teamwork".

In 2005 Latino Officer Tony organized 90 kids into six soccer teams. Other Officers followed suite in their neighborhoods by actively recruiting kids into teams. By 2016 when P.A.C.E. was officially organized in South Omaha, graffiti had decreased by 97%, gangs decreased by 77% and shootings had gone down over 70%. Programs have expanded to include girls baseball, crossfit training, KOPS law enforcement educational training camps, ACT preparation classes, flag football and cooperation with other after school programs and kid programs, such as Completely Kids, - besides the original soccer. In 2016 over 1,000 students took part in activities, in 2017 over 2,000 in 2018 over 4,000 and this year they are expecting over 5,000 participants. They have expanded beyond South Omaha into all over Omaha. If selected the monies would be used for transportation or equipment.
