Board of Trustee's Election Results

The Out-of-State Vehicle Sales Tax ballot issue failed with seventeen (17) Yes votes and one hundred sixty-six (166) No votes. The Village of Innsbrook will continue to collect the local sales tax on the titling of motor vehicles, trailers, boats and outboard motors that are purchased from a source other than a licensed Missouri dealer. On April 12, 2016 newly elected Trustee Ted Sator and incumbent Trustee Tom Stevener were sworn into public office on the Board of Trustees. Jeff Thomsen will continue to serve as Chairman, a position



he has held since 2011. Jerry Rust will serve as Village Board Clerk. Outgoing Trustee Bob Dowdle was presented with an American Flag which was flown over the U.S. Capital and Village Hall thanking him for his years of service on the Village of Innsbrook Board of Trustees.

2016-2017 Village of Innsbrook Budget

The Board of Trustees held a public hearing on June 14, 2016 at 7:30pm to discuss the proposed 2016-2017 budget for the Village of Innsbrook. After the public hearing the Board of Trustees approved and adopted the 2016-2017 Fiscal Year Budget. August 2, 2016 Primary Election

Don't forget to vote on Tuesday, August 2nd, polls open at 6am and close at 7pm. Village Hall, located at 1835 Highway F, is the polling place for Innsbrook residents. According to the Missouri Secretary of State website, a summary of office's up for election are U.S. Senator, Governor, Lieutenant Governor, Secretary of State, State Treasurer, Attorney General, U.S. Representative, State Senator, State Representative and Circuit Judge.

Honeysuckle

The honeysuckle plant comes in 180 different varieties, some of which are native to the United States, like the trumpet honeysuckle or the native yellow honeysuckle. But the plant that most gardeners are concerned with properly identifying is the invasive Japanese honeysuckle. Native to Japan and first introduced to America in 1806 as a fastgrowing ornamental shrub used for ground cover, it slowly escaped clutivation and became widely established by the 1900s. The Japanese honeysuckle is an aggressive, invasive vine, readily colonizing new habitats. Birds are attracted to the purplish-black fruits, which persist into winter, and distribute the seeds along fencerows, into fields and natural communities. Japanese honeysuckle soon dominates an environment by smothering and killing native plants by spreading along the ground. It forms dense mats and climbs shrubs and trees, often donimating tree canopies. The Japanese honeysuckle is a perennial semi-evergreen vine. Opposite, oval glossy leaves less than 3 inches in length that remain green into late winter and tubular white to yellow flowers at the leaf axils help to identify Japanese honeysuckle. There are various methods to control the spread of this invasive vine. Individual young vines can be pulled up by the roots and removed from sparsely populated areas. This method requires that the entire plant, including all roots, runners and seed be removed to avoid re-sprouthing. In areas of heavy infestation, vines can be cut by hand, and each cut stem sprayed with an herbicide. However, the cut stump treatment is best applied after the last killing frost and prior to spring wildflower emergence to prevent harm to non-target species. Foliar herbicides are often the most efficient means of control in areas with extensive growth and can be applied in late fall to minimize harm to native vegetation. MU Extension

Innsbrook resident, Linda Buschman, was reappointed on February 9, 2016 by the Innsbrook Board of Trustees to serve as a representative of the Village of Innsbrook to the Warren County University of Missouri Extension Council. The MU Extension is located at 107 West Walton Street in Warrenton and offers many programs and services to our community. For a small fee, the extension office offers basic soil testing which could result in fertilizer and lime recommendations. Plant and insect samples may be brought to the extension office for identification or disease diagnosis. The MU Extension also has publications available to purchase on agriculture, natural resources, lawn and garden, home and consumer life, nutrition and health, families, community and leadership development, business and careers, emergency management and other topics. If you have an interest in gardening, a willingness to learn and a desire to give back to local communities through volunteer service and education, become a Master Gardener. After completing an online training course, Master Gardeners expand the reach of University of Missouri Extension using research-based horticulture information to answer gardening questions in their local communities. Master Gardeners take on several community projects and consist of individuals who enjoy learning and sharing their gardening knowledge.
