I want to extend my sincere congratulations to the incoming team of officers. I hope they will lead this Lodge with enthusiasm and dedication.



are to be voted upon at the Lodge Meeting MARCH 10, 2026**

**Proposed By-Law Amendments**

**ARTICLE V: ELECTIVE OFFICERS AND DUTIES**

**OF THE SECRETARY**

Sec. 4. "...For the faithful performance of his duties he shall receive as compensation ~~\$17,582.00~~ \$18,450.00 per annum, payable every two weeks..."

**OF THE TREASURER**

Sec.5. "...and shall receive as compensation for his services the sum of ~~\$3,521.00~~ \$3,700.00 per annum, payable every two weeks."

**ARTICLE X: FEES AND DUES**

Section 1.

ADD "...The Lodge shall have reduced initiation fee of one dollar (\$1.00) for the months of September and October."

**HOUSE RULES**

~~6. All Members and Guest(s) will be permitted to wear their hats in the Jolly Cork Room. Hats will not be allowed in the Dining Room, upstairs, or Frey Hall, without the approval of the Lodge floor, and for special events only, or by permission of the Exalted Ruler.~~

ADD ... "All Members and Guest(s) are permitted to wear hats throughout the Lodge with exception of the Lodge floor during Lodge meetings."

7. Pets shall not be allowed in any part of the Lodge or Club. Exception: Certified Service Dogs for the ~~handieapped~~ *disabled* under the American Disability Act (ADA).

Guidelines for the Hill and our Campers Revised May 2025 Date pending  
(These rules are in addition and include the registration invoice you signed)

All rule modification may occur at the discretion of the Board of Directors

Hill Repairs Maintenance

No Camper or Visitor is allowed to ~~work~~ perform maintenance on Elk property without consent from the Board of Directors.

No Officer or Elk representative is allowed to work on Camper property unless contracted by the Camper and it is understood that the Westminster Elks is not liable for any situation occurring to the Camper property.

Reservations

NO reservations are permitted.

Pre-Paid spots can be acquired for 1 – 30 days prior to your arrival. Please contact the camp host with credit card number to secure your space. Please understand that you are paying from the day that you request a spot be held.

~~If the bartender is not in, i.e., before 10am or after Lodge hours the Camper wait for e[C]redit card approval is required before a spot can be assigned. before they can expect to have a spot waiting for them.~~

Camp spaces may not be subleased.

Donations

New arrivals must contact the camp host to be registered prior to pulling into the camp spot. Space must be paid for at this time. The only exception to this is paying with a credit card. Which must be taken care of within 24 hours at the lodge.

All donations are due on the 1<sup>st</sup> day of stay for the anticipated stay.

For long stay Elks, donations are due the first day of the month. Donations are past due by the 5<sup>th</sup> of the month; at 10 days you will be asked to leave.

Special accommodation (payment) must be approved by the BOD before past due period.

Campers can *obtain and* pay for their spot in advance, leave within that time and come back to their spot which we will hold for them ~~as long as it is still paid for.~~ *through the length of payment.*

Site/RV Expectations

Use of the camping area is limited to Westminster Elks Members and their guests, Members in good standing of other Lodges and their guests, provided the Elk Member is present and ~~in good standing a registered camper.~~

Utility hook-ups (water and sewer) require proper connection and gasket. And are to be free from leaks and properly sealed.

**ALL HOSES** must be **DISCONNECTED** when the temperature drops below **36 DEGREES, NO EXCEPTIONS.**

Dumping of gray or black water *directly on the ground* is ~~NOT~~ *never* permitted. ~~on the ground and only in designated locations.~~

The SPEED LIMIT is 5mph on Westminster Elks property.

RVs need to be in designated areas, including slide outs and awnings.

RVs shall not be left unattended for more than 72 hours without prior notification to Camp Host ~~ahead of time.~~

~~Guests wishing to stay overnight must contact the camp host. The Camp host must be notified of all overnight guests.~~

~~Help us conserve our resources by using water and electricity responsibly.~~

~~Absolutely no washing of RVs or vehicles is allowed.~~

~~Only one AC unit is to be used at a time. Turn off AC when RV is unoccupied.~~

~~Please refrain from using washers and dryers during peak energy and water usage hours, 3pm-7pm.~~

~~Permanent structures (gazebos, awnings, appliances etc.), tents, tarps, pop-ups or other structures are prohibited.~~

~~No tents, pop-ups, extra appliances, etc.~~

~~Skirting is not allowed May through September. Contact Board of Directors if skirting storage is needed.~~

~~No items are to be stored under your RV. Small grills and camp chairs are allowed.~~

~~Clear weeds from your site as needed. Weeds shall not exceed 6" tall.~~

~~All RV's must be in good working order. No flat tires, no broken windows etc.~~

~~All RV's, trailers, tow vehicles and cars are to have a current DMV registration and current tags.~~

~~Any Camper with a travel trailer or 5<sup>th</sup> wheel must have present an operational tow vehicle.~~

~~All vehicles, including tow, ~~to~~ must be free of leaks (oil, anti-freeze, etc.).~~

~~No parking of cars/trucks in **unused** sites or in Traffic lanes.~~

~~Guests must park in the Lodge parking lot.~~

~~Campers with tow trailers or second vehicles must speak to the Camp Host for approval prior to parking~~

~~Do not leave grills, fire pits, smokers, etc. unattended.~~

~~Charcoal or wood burning appliances are prohibited during local fire bans or *at the discretion of BOD.*~~

~~Pets are welcome and are the responsibility of the owner. Pets must be kept on a leash at all times. Pet fencing or pet pens are allowed *but must* be kept in good repair. Do not tie pets to trees. Pets are allowed in the designated pet areas only. No pets are permitted in the grassy common areas. All pet waste is to be disposed of in the dumpsters, NOT the trash cans on the pavilions. PLEASE CLEAN UP AFTER YOUR PET!~~

~~Do not feed wildlife, including but not limited to fox, raccoon, coyote, squirrels and feral cats.~~

~~Do not leave food (pet or human) out unattended.~~

~~Please be considerate of neighboring campers when smoking, playing music, etc. Quiet time is from 10 pm to 8 am.~~

~~Obscene and/or boisterous language will not be permitted.~~

~~Any willful or malicious destruction of property shall be paid for by the person(s) responsible *and they will no longer be welcome on the premises.* Lodge Members are responsible for their guests.~~

~~By signing this registration form you agree to adhere to and understands these rules associated with the use of Westminster Elks 2227 camping facilities. ~~Violations of these rules will result disciplinary action by the Board of Directors.~~~~

### Receiving mail and parcels to the Lodge address

#### **The Lodge is not responsible for lost or stolen mail or parcels**

Long term Campers are required to obtain a Post Office Box. Any mail received otherwise shall be picked up within 24 hours. Any mail or parcels not retrieved as set forth above will be returned to the sender.

### Vehicles other than main Rig

The Roadway is to be clear for Emergency Vehicles.

Campers may park their extra vehicle, *boat trailer, car dolly* or tow trailer in the Elks parking lot for the length of their stay.

The BOD will make determinations on any other situations *on a case-by-case basis.*

~~Parking and storage of extra vehicles may be stored one time for 30 days with approval of the Board of Directors must be approved by the Board of Directors.~~

~~(Extra is defined as more than 1 car / truck, trailer, boat, RV or any other device.)~~

~~Parking 1 vehicle by RV's is allowed only in spots 1, 9, 11, and 22.~~

~~For the top area Parking for spots 2-8 & 12-21, only loading and unloading, for a short time, is allowed. Ask the camp host for designated parking spots.~~

~~Parking for spots 23 to 30 is allowed in designated parking spots only.~~

~~Parking for spots 31 to 40 is limited to 2 vehicles only.~~

~~The parking of 2 vehicles is only permitted in spots 31-40.~~

### Stay Times-Limits

~~Parking Lot Wall, 2 weeks on, 2 weeks off~~

~~Hill Spaces, 6 months on, 6 months off~~

~~Stay Limits: Parking Lot Wall, 2 weeks on, 2 weeks off. Hill spaces 6 months on, 6 months off. Spaces 11-30 closed for FALL/Winter.~~

~~Approval from the Board of Directors needed for extended stay. Submit, in writing, to the BOD's.~~

~~Effective for all new campers at the date of this writing.~~

~~Current campers already in place at writing (2/13/2019) revision can remain.~~

~~Spaces 1 thru 9, \$26 per night~~

~~Spaces 11 thru 22, \$23 per night~~

**Camper Volunteers** (we appreciate our Campers as Volunteers!)

It is not mandatory for any Camper to do any Hill maintenance. (*other than maintaining a weed free camping spot.*)

However, there are many jobs that our Campers can do.....

Landscaping, i.e., weeds (around the buildings), lawn, trash cleanup, tree limb cleanup, etc. If you wish to volunteer Please see the ~~Camp Host or a Lodge Officer~~ who can put you in touch with the appropriate Officer.

Volunteering for Lodge events (Lodge Picnics, Lodge Breakfast/Dinners, Kitchen help etc.) is strongly encouraged. A successful Lodge depends on volunteers. Please contact an officer or House Committee member.

Jobs requiring purchase of parts or operating Elk equipment need to be approved by the BOD.

Our lodge offers meals several times a week. We also have activities that include darts, horseshoes, Etc. There are several picnics, barbecues and other events scheduled throughout the year.
