FRANK W. HUBBARD RITES HELD MONDAY 12-30-1943

Detroit, Jan. 3— Funeral services for Frank Watson Hubbard, Detroit and Thumb banker, who died at 12:55 p.m. Thursday in his home at 16900 East Jefferson avenue after an illness of several months, were conducted at 2 p.m. Monday in his home.

Active pallbearers were six business associates and close friends of Mr. Hubbard from the Thumb, Joseph N. Rankin, James L. Burgess, Joseph R. Harris and Oscar Rogers, all of Bad Axe; Milton L. Ackerman, Elkton, and William R. Everingham, Kinde.

Frank Watson Hubbard was a member of a pioneer Thumb family, active in the development of the district from a wilderness to a prosperous and productive agricultural and business area.

Born in Port Huron April 16, 1863, Mr. Hubbard went to Huron City with his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Langdon Hubbard, when he was a small boy. He made Huron county his home thereafter until he moved to Detroit 37 years ago. Langdon Hubbard first bought
