From Our Pastor:

"This Changes Everything" is the theme for the 2018 ELCA Youth Gathering which takes place June 27 – July 1 in Houston, TX. I, along with many other people, have been working on this Gathering for over 2 years and this month, all of our planning, work, sweat, and even some tears will come to fruition in the 2 Pre-Gathering Events (MYLE and the tAble) and the Gathering itself. Not only have the people tasked with planning these events been preparing and working towards, the participant groups and their supporters have also been preparing and working towards these events for quite some time. There is a lot of time spent in preparation, prayer, intentional study and fellowship, planning, fund-raising, etc...that goes into participating in these Pre-Gathering and Gathering events. What is it that everyone has been preparing and planning for??? Read on to learn about the components that make up the 2018 ELCA Youth Gathering.

Participants will take part in various program areas during the Gathering: Community Life, Interactive Learning, Mass Gathering, Service Learning, and Synod Day. I've recently been asked what it is that I'm doing for the Gathering, I'm serving as the Team Leader for Volunteers. There are 3 full time Gathering staff members based in Chicago, 15 Team Leaders from across the country, and countless members on each team. The Volunteers team has over 400 members and with 4 groups within the team, GVC (Gathering Volunteer Corps), Servant Companions, Local Volunteers, Chaplains. Members of the Volunteers team will be present in virtually every aspect and area of the Gathering, serving in a variety of roles.

It takes not only a lot of dedicated and faithful people to prepare for, plan, and participate in this event...it takes a lot of people to support all of those participating! Once again, I cannot thank the congregation enough for your inquisitive questions, your interest, and for your support in my role and participation in the Gathering. I ask for continued prayers for everyone involved and if you'd like to see for yourself, what this is all about, I invite you to participate by checking out the livestream Mass Gathering programs in the evenings of June 27-30 and the morning of July 1... remember Houston is on Central Time. Worship Leaders Informational Training: One of the aspects I appreciate about worship in a Lutheran setting is that it's participatory, in fact, the word "liturgy" (another word we use for worship service) means "work of the people." In other words, the worship service, the liturgy, is designed to be participatory, that both leaders and the assembled congregation participate in worship.

We will have informational and training sessions for the following worship roles: Communion Assistants, Readers, and Ushers. All current communion assistants, readers, and ushers are asked to sign up for one of these trainings (as we have some new information to share). If you would like to find out more about or would like to serve in one or more of these roles, please sign-up for one of these trainings. The goal is for ALL (current and new) Communion Assistants, Readers, and Ushers to be given training and current information. Informational Trainings will be held on a variety of dates, please sign up in the office for your selected time and if one of these dates/times doesn't work for you, please talk to Pastor Jennifer to make other arrangements. If need be, we can add additional dates/times but we'll start with these:

Wednesday, June 13 at 10:00 am Saturday, June 16 at 9:00 am Sunday, July 8 after worship

At this year's Synod Assembly held on May 18-19 at Hope Lutheran Church in Palm Desert, there was a resolution urging all congregations to take time and study the "Draft Social Statement on Women and Justice" and submit responses by September 30 to the task force. In an effort to familiarize ourselves with this draft social statement and follow the protocol for responding, we will take some time this summer to have conversations about this draft. Recognizing that there may likely be a variety of reactions and responses to this draft, there will be intentional language and work to create a safe space for people to discuss, even though opinions may vary greatly. To allow adequate time to read and familiarize ourselves with this draft, we will have our discussion sessions on Sunday mornings in August at 9:00 am in the Fireside Room...please make sure to bring your copy with you to these sessions. 31st Annual Synod Assembly Resolution

The assembly voted to pass Resolution 18.02, Encouragement to Study "Women and Justice".

The ELCA is engaged in a concerted discussion around women and justice in church and society. The 2009 Churchwide Assembly authorized a social statement process and in 2016 a 137 page study guide, "Faith, Sexism, Justice: Conversations Toward a Social Statement " was created for use across our church. Feed back from the participants was due on August 31, 2017 and used to create the "Draft Social Statement on Women and Justice" for study and response prior to September 30, 2018. The final draft will be brought before the 2019 Churchwide Assembly for adoption.

- WHEREAS, girls and women experience exclusion, prejudice, and violence on a daily basis due to gender, and
- WHEREAS, the Scriptures and church tradition are used by people to keep women in subordinate identity and roles in church and society, and
- WHEREAS, members of the Pacifica Synod have differing views of these realities, and
- WHEREAS, the Lutheran tradition of education. study, and respectful conversation is a treasured part of our life together, and
- WHEREAS, the process of developing Social Statements depends upon broad participation across the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA) with the goal of adopting a Social Statement after extensive consultation and with broad support, and
- WHEREAS, the ELCA has prepared a Draft Social Statement on Women and Justice, which draft social statement has been made available to all congregations, and asked for responses by September 30, 2018; therefore be it
- RESOLVED, that all congregations and members are urged to study the ELCA's Draft
 Social Statement on Women and Justice and send their comments to the
 Task Force on Women and Justice before September 30, 2018.
