Please don't stop the drivers of the snow removal equipment when they are plowing to chat or complain, they are trying to get a time sensitive job completed. If you have concerns or questions about snow removal, please call Town Hall, or me directly, to discuss them.

Again, I remind you to move your cars off the street whenever possible to make room for the plowing. The wider the streets can be plowed, the better it is in the event of another snowfall.
