

Angolan Ambassador Analyzes Partnership with the US

Angolan ambassador to the United States, Agostinho Tavares, discussed with North Dakota governor Doug Burgum the possibility of a partnership in the agricultural sector, according to a note from the Angolan diplomatic representation in Washington.



The meeting between the two entities is part of the trip made by the Angolan diplomat to the capital of the state of North Dakota, held from 1 to 2 May. Among other things, the meeting included promoting and attracting investment in the agricultural sector, as well as providing information on new private investment policies.

Agostinho Tavares also met with officials of US companies interested in investing in Angola.

The diplomat answered some questions posed by local businessmen, having clarified doubts related to the legal procedures for the importation of agricultural equipment.

The Ambassador also provided information on the opportunities for local partnerships and the availability of land, giving a snapshot of existing infrastructures for facilitating the practice of farming. Agriculture accounts for nearly a quarter of the state's economy in North Dakota and accounts for about 25 percent of its workforce.

Martinho Codo, Angolan consul general in Los Angeles, California, and Domingos Nazaré, National Director of Agriculture and Forestry, accompanied the Ambassador during his visit.
