Secretary Minutes As of March 4th, 2009.

On March 4, 2009 the GSSN met at the American Legion in Henderson NV. The meeting began at 6:35 PM with President Nic Johnson leading the group in the Pledge of Allegiance. Nic asked if anyone had found gold. He then announced that future meetings will begin at 6:30 PM. He said there would be a speaker at the April 1st meeting and then spoke about GSSN's involvement with the McCaw School of Mines. John Sears (Cooter) may participate in the program; and Fred Zajac explained what McCaw does and mentioned that McCaw needs more docents and said he could be contacted for further info.

Next Barre Kennerly gave the Treasurer's Report and said that future monthly financial reports will reflect monies on hand as of the first of each month with income and expenditures applied showing the balance at the end of each month. Barre summarized the January and February reports and said that the money on hand as of Feb. 28, 2009 was \$1959.26. He is in the process of preparing the final monthly report for February which will reflect up-todate figures.

Nic then asked members for approval of the January 2009 minutes (as posted in the Highgrader) and Fred Zajac made a motion to do so; Morris Seguin seconded the motion. The vote was unanimously in favor of approving the motion. There was a brief break at this time to allow our guest speaker, Bill Durban, chief of the Southern Nevada Operations of The NV Div. Of Minerals' Abandoned Mine Lands/ Mineral Education Programs, to set up his presentation on Nevada's abandoned mines. Bill's talk was extremely interesting and educational. He described some vignettes illustrating examples of situations he's dealt with during his 20 years as geologist with the NV Division of Minerals. After his talk the group took a brief break to allow the "show and tell" participants (who included Nic Johnson, Morris Seguin, Jake Jakl and Fred Zajac) to set up their homemade or customized tools and equipment (e.g., sluice, dry washer, clas-Continued on Page 2
