Super's Report

Bob McGeever Division Superintendent

A few words about the Company Store and SCWD finances this month.

Despite all the work we put into the annual Train Show, our goal is to almost break even on the show. Some years we make some money and some years we lose some money. When we make money most of it goes into our reserves. We do not purchase event insurance to cover us for low show attendance caused by bad weather. We self-insure for that by building up our reserves. We have tapped into the reserves several times in the past decade. There was an ice storm on the Sunday of the first show I worked. I think we had more vendor, layout, and SCWD staff in the hall than we had paying customers. We did not make money on that show. But we had healthy reserves so we survived.

The Company Store is an important source of funds to run the division. Many years it can cover the majority of our expenses. The Company Store is not just our sales booth at the train show. The Company Store and the Estate Planning Chair work together to provide a service to our members and members families. Eventually, every model railroad has to be taken apart. Sometimes the modeler is downsizing and must give up the layout. Sometimes health issues force the modeler to give up the layout. Sadly, often the modeler has passed away.

For all the time we spend planning the construction of our layouts, very few of us have a plan to de-construct it. There are a lot of items on or attached to a layout that have some resale value. This is where the Company Store and the Estate Planning Chair can help

members of the division. Items of value can be sold by the store on consignment or donated to the SCWD for resale to fund the division.

Informally, the Company Store has also been providing a tear down service for layouts when the items of value have been donated to the SCWD. At a minimum, we collect the items of value from the layout. Sometimes we break out the power tools and remove the whole layout. I am looking for some new volunteers to help with this service. I won't name any names but the current crew is starting to "age out" of demolition work. We could use a couple of young guys in their 50's or early 60's on this crew.

It is unfortunate that a good year for the Company Store usually means some of our members have had a bad year. So far this year, the Company Store is not having a good year. This is good for our members so I am not complaining.

It looks like this is would be a good year to clean out our model railroad closets and donate to the Company Store. Most of us have good quality stuff we are never going to use just taking up space. By donating some of it to the Company Store you can pay some of the rent on our meeting hall or fund the annual picnic and banquet.

Modeling Project Rules:

- 1. There may be only one entry per person
- 2. There will be one contest for Adult and one for Youth.
- 3. The adult category entry fee is \$10 regardless of scale. Youth entry fee is \$5 or an amount determined by the Youth Group.
- 4. Project guidelines:
- a. Sign up at the September or October meetings.
- b. Pay the entry fee at sign-up or when the kit is picked up.
- c. Complete your diorama and bring the project to the April 2016 SCWD meet.
- d. Entries will be judged by popular vote at the April 2016 meet.
- e. Entry fee will be returned only if the project is completed and entered for judging.
- f. Placings will be determined by popular vote, and prizes awarded for 1st, 2nd and 3rd place.
- 5. Project rules:
- a. Must utilize the kit provided in some fashion. Modifications are allowed.
- b. Base must be no larger than 100 square inches (HO),
- 25 square inches (N) or 400 square inches in O.
- c. Backdrop should be included, but not mandatory
- d. Track and rolling stock can be part of the diorama.
- e. Kit contains material to construct the basic building; walls, windows, dock material, roof and roofing materials.
- f. Additional materials may be used, e.g. ground cover, ballast, buildings, track and scenery material.

Prizes:

- a. Awards total \$300 in gift certificates from The Madison Hobby Stop.
- b. 1st place is a \$75 gift certificate, 2nd place is a \$50 gift certificate, and 3rd place is \$25 gift certificate for both Adult and Youth entries.

Dave Lendved and Steve Lanphear Contest Co-Chairs

In 1872, the P.T. Barnum Circus had grown too large to be transported efficiently on horseback and wagons. Barnum and his partners decided to use a dedicated train for transport be-



tween venues. Unhappy with the Pennsylvania Railroads poorly maintained equipment, the Circus purchased their own cars and the Circus Train was born.

Barnum's was the first of many circuses to crisscross the United States over the next 145 years. The Circus Train was a unique American innovation. Barnum's system of runs, crossover plates, ropes and pulleys along with snubber posts, was devised to get wagons on and off flatcars. Similar technology was adopted by class 1 railroads for TOFC service in the 1960's.

The Circus Train provided a setting or many famous books and movies. The Ringling Bros. and Barnum & Bailey Circus Red Unit was the last Circus Train. Its last run was in May.



School is an opportunity for the SCWD to showcase its wealth of talent and share it with the community.



As you may know, the Badger State Trail multi-use path is built on the former right-of-way of the Illinois Central line from Freeport to Madison. In 1888 the IC built a depot near CTH M and Wendt Road at the unincorporated village of Fitchburg.





The depot was torn down in 1939 after passenger service was discontinued around 1926.



In 2013 the City of Fitchburg and Fitchburg Historical Society placed an historic marker at the site of the depot.

Now, several groups are looking to build a replica of the depot adjacent to its original location. The replica depot will serve as a trailhead for the bike path, act as an historical museum for Fitchburg and the rail line, and provide a

community meeting place. Bike Fitchburg and the Fitchburg Chamber & Visitors Bureau have secured \$157,500 in matching funds from the City of Fitchburg and are beginning to gear up their fundraising efforts. Stay tuned for updates.


