Keep Paddling

1 Cor. 10:12 "So, if you think you are standing firm, be careful that you don't fall..."

I was watching a reality TV show called "Dual Survival". Two guys are teamed up to survive harsh and wild nature conditions without any proper gear, let alone food and water. In one episode, they had to cross over a churning river on a makeshift raft, using oars made from broken branches. Of course, it was difficult for them to control where they were going on the raft through the rolling, white waters. They pulled as hard as they could on the oars, but it was no use. Then one guy was unable to keep up paddling, but the other guy said, "Keep it up. Keep paddling or we won't be able to go where we want on the river."

What the guy said reminded me of our marriages. One major reason marriages are on the rocks is because we stop paddling... I mean we stop trying. We put all our passion and time into trying to attract each other at the beginning of the relationship. We listen more attentively than talking. We take care of the other more than being taken care of. However, these loving gestures are often ignored in a marriage. We stop paddling in thinking that we're on the right track since we are in this marriage. That's why many marriages hit rock bottom or finally end up drifting in an unexpected direction.

The real problem is not the lack of love or good intentions, but the fact that:

- We are not aware of the current on the river.
- We don't really grasp what our partner wants and have no idea on how to get back on track.

This attitude is found in our relationship with Christ too. Being titled as a Christian doesn't automatically mean we are in Christ. Being baptized doesn't necessarily mean we are a saved person either. But you must know that we can easily fall into sin and be away from the love of God. Getting close to Him and growing in faith requires our efforts to know and learn more about the Lord. We must keep paddling if only to be in the right direction with God.



Stewardship Corner

The following are the last five of ten "Essential Truths" regarding Christian Tithing. The first five were shared in the February Chimes.

- 6. The Bible teaches that Christian giving should be done in light of the incarnation. Many Christians argue about whether the tithe (10% of our income) is still the standard for our giving to the Church (disputants usually want to show that less than 10% is fine). Paul scuttles the whole debate in one verse. He says: "For you know the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, that though He was rich, yet for your sake He became poor, so that you through His poverty might become rich" (2 Corinthians 8:9). Christ's self-giving is now the standard for our giving! We begin from the base of the tithe and aim for emulation of His self-sacrifice. Our giving is to be inspired and instructed by Christ's inexpressible gift. In light of such a challenge, who could possibly satisfy himself with asking "how little a percentage is acceptable for me to give?" Do you try to get by with giving as little as possible to the Lord, or do you give in view of the Lord's costly sacrifice?
- 7. **The Bible teaches that Christian giving should be done in accordance with our means.** Paul is quite clear on this: "For if the readiness is present, it is acceptable according to what a person has, not according to what he does not have" (2 Corinthians 8:12). Put another way Paul is saying that you should give in proportion to what God has given you. He said it this way in (1 Corinthians 16:2), "each one of you is to put aside and save, as he may prosper." This means at least two things: (1) since we are all supposed to give proportionately, those who have money are expected to give more [we who are particularly blessed materially must remember this], and (2) the Lord never asks us to give what we do not have, or contribute beyond our means. **Are you really giving in proportion to the material blessings that the Lord has given you?**
- 8. The Bible teaches that the liberality of God's blessings to us is connected to the liberality of our Christian giving. Though it may seem strange, both Jesus and Paul emphasize that there is a relation between our giving to the Lord and the Lord's giving to us. As Paul says in (2 Corinthians 9:6) "Now this I say, he who sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and he who sows bountifully will also reap bountifully." About this matter J.A. Beet once said: "They who in giving think, not how little they can give, as they would if self-enrichment were the aim, but of benefits to be conferred, will receive back on the same principle. As they do to others, so God will act to them." Jesus reminds us of this in (Matthew 6:4), where He teaches that our reward in giving comes from our heavenly Father. As someone once said: "The desire to be generous and the means to be generous both come from God." Do you realize that the Lord has given you much, so that you can give much?
- 9. The Bible teaches that Christian giving must be willing giving, free giving. We learn this in (2 Corinthians 9:7) "Each one must do just as he has purposed in his heart, not grudgingly or under compulsion." But doesn't this contradict what we learned under the first principle, that Christian giving is not optional? The answer is, of course, no. True Christian giving is both mandatory and voluntary. It is required by God, but always willingly given by the believer. Is your giving to the Church something you do wholeheartedly, or indifferently, or grudgingly?
- 10. The Bible teaches that Christian giving ought to be cheerful giving. As Paul says "God loves a cheerful giver." This is a truly amazing assertion. Paul assures us here that the Lord takes a special delight in those who are joyful, energetic, merry givers. Is there joy in your heart as you give? Can you truly be characterized as a "cheerful giver"?

We have not come close to reaching our potential for giving. Won't you pray that we will give as we ought? That we will give for the right motives? That we will give joyously? And that we will give extravagantly.

Thoughts for the Journey—How We Worship...

THE WORSHIP OF GOD IS THE HEART OF THE CHRISTIAN FAITH AND CENTER OF OUR LIFE TOGETHER IN THE CHURCH. The Westminster Shorter Catechism affirms that our chief end in life is "to glorify God and enjoy Him forever." This places the worship of God at the very center of what it means to be God's people and makes worship the highest expression we can render to our God-given humanity. Christian worship is a corporate act of the people of God where we gather to realize God's presence and respond with praise to God's gift of love to us in Jesus Christ.

The next several months this column will focus individual acts of worship that take place each Sunday.

THE SACRAMENTS

The Sacraments observed by Presbyterians are the Lord's Supper (also called Holy Communion or the Eucharist) and Baptism. Both sacraments were instituted by Christ, who invited His disciples to observe them. A sacrament is a visible sign of an invisible grace. Both point to the incarnate Word and declare that Jesus Christ is present.

Communion is the re-enactment of Jesus' last meal in the Upper Room as described in the Gospels and in 1 Corinthians. It is a holy celebration of the presence of Christ, who is risen and alive. Holy Communion points to our union with Christ as we live and work within the community of faith. The Lord's Supper is usually celebrated at least once per month. Our celebration coincides with special days in the life of the Church.

Baptism, the act of cleansing, marks our reception into the household of God. Following the New Testament practice, the baptism of infants, adults, and children requires a commitment of the congregation to nurture the Christian growth of each individual as a member of the family of faith. Baptism is scheduled through the pastor at the request of an individual.

Let's begin to approach our morning of worship as we enter the Sanctuary—directing our hearts and minds towards our gracious God in order to glorify Him and give ourselves totally to Him in praise and worship.
