INTERSECTION OF CAMERON ROAD AND 183/ANDERSON LANE



A few months ago, Texas
Department of Transportation
posted a 'lane pattern change'
sign on Cameron Rd., going
north bound, at the 183 intersection. Later, they posted
'lane street' signs, allowing
both the left-hand lane and
the center-lane the ability to
turn left, at the same time.
The posted 'lane street' signs

are located under the overpass of 183 and the north side of 183. There are some concerns from our residents, that use that intersection. It appears that some drivers are not aware of the changes. Some drivers are apparently still trying to squeeze into the left-hand turn lane to make a left turn. We are requesting TxDot, to post a 'lane street' sign, at the top of the over-pass(much like other major highway intersections). This will allow the visibility of the lane signs to be seen, before you get to the intersection.

If you choose to open the door for an unwelcomed trick-or-treater, please be polite and just tell the children to try the next house.

No major change with other area developments:

7205 Cameron Rd / 1500 E. St, John's Ave. (vacant lot across from the high school, along St. John's, behind EMS on Berkman)—Heavy machinery has begun the initial clearing for a multi-family building with 150 apartment units and associated land improvements. No opposition has been expressed.

1701 E. Anderson Lane (vacant lot along the Buttermilk Creek across from the cul-de-sacs)—The developer requested a postponement to the Nov. 28th Planning Commission meeting. The applicant's agent, HELM Corporate Real Estate Strategy, is requesting to change the zoning from Commercial to Mixed-use. The City's Planning Dept. recommendation is "pending."
