JULY STORY CIRCLE

On July 21, fourteen (14) Broomfield Spellbinders and one guest (whom **Denny Thompson** recognized as a former neighbor from 50 years ago in Brush CO) gathered at Brunner Farm House for our final Summer Story Circle. **Donna Leard** opened with "Kelwyn and the Lady," a story from and old *Storytelling* magazine. **Sherry Potter** shared "One Wish," an Irish folk tale from *More Ready-to-Tell Tales*, and **Betsy Crosby** told a personal story about her adventure in a car wash. **Marc Brown** discussed his recent health challenges as a lead-in to singing "The Long Black Veil," and **Wynn Montgomery** offered "The Three Pears"--a pun-filled parody from *Storytwisting* by Jeri Burns & Barry Marshall (The Storycrafters). **Julie Toepper** then told "Pedro & Diablo," a Joe Hayes story, and **Jim Mariner** shared a true story from his years as a teacher in Colorado Springs. **Vicki Tiedeman** asked for suggestions on how to tell "Lazy Jack" to a child with hearing difficulties similar to those experienced by the girl in the story, and several

responded that their version simply says that the girl had never laughed and does not offer a reason. **Tiffany Painter** talked about her trip to NYC, where she tried to visit (and make a purchase at) "all the bookstores." While looking for a book she could afford in a store that specialized in antique books, she found *Ladybug*, *Ladybug* (by Kathleen N. Daly and Susan C. Smith) and plans to tell it this year. **Cathy Lichty** (at right) wrapped up the session by sharing an original story called "Anansi and the Museum Gnomes" that she developed for students who



were so disappointed when she ran out of Anansi stories that they wrote their own. Four members (**Sheila Brush, Marsha Coons, Karen Green, and Denny Thompson**) did not share a story, but were attentive listeners who offered feedback and suggestions.
