## From The Minister's Mac

## "Our Angry God"

This Sunday, we will look at another text from the Book of Amos, finishing a 2-week exploration of this seemingly dire prophecy from one of God's reluctant prophets. Last week, Amos told the children of God that God was angry at them. This week, we learn why.

To hear the full list of grievances, you'll either need to dip into the book of Amos yourself, or listen to the sermon Sunday. But I will give you a small teaser of what to expect: One of the items on the list that made God mad was "making the ephah small and the shekel great." In other words, God doesn't like it when we charge more and give less.

We know about paying more for less, don't we?

The other day, I opened a can of asparagus — I know, I know, we prefer fresh asparagus too, but all we had at the time was a can — and found only eleven spears. Eleven! Brian and I both agreed that the cans used to hold more and that what we had in front of us looked pretty pitiful. I looked at the asparagus label and it said the can contained about  $3\frac{1}{2}$  servings, and that a serving was 7 spears. So, we received fewer than 2 servings, and paid twice as much as we used to pay in the past.

I imagine that's the kind of business practice Amos was talking about, and I imagine each one of you have your own experience to tell. We may think about this as if it is a recent occurrence, but this has actually been going on for a very long time. Remember when TV was free? Remember when they pumped your gas at the "service" station?

The question isn't whether or not we recognize today the same kind of practices God saw in Israel that were so anger-inducing; the question is, what do we do about them when we see them? Or maybe more importantly, how do we keep from engaging in or profiting from the systemic injustices that have been part of human society for centuries?

# Noah's Community Outreach

You PROBABLY know Noah's Community Outreach collects clothing and hygiene items throughout the year, to distribute (in backpacks) to people in our community who are unhoused. Right now we are prepping for winter, buying sleeping bags and watching for sales on warm clothing, socks, etc. Last year we distributed 37-ish backpacks; this coming year we hope to distribute 50 or more.

You MAY know Noah's Community Outreach provides Saturday night supper, twice a month, for people who stay overnight in the Hope for Longmont shelter (usually about 30 guests).

You MAY NOT know - we are now partnering with Hope for Longmont to provide lunches throughout the week. Hope for Longmont serves 300 lunches each month at their food bank location, and another 100 as their outreach team meets people around town who need and will accept support. Each week, we provide supplies like sandwiches, snacks, drinks, and fruit for them to distribute. This week we took them some hard-boiled eggs! We by no means meet the entire need, but we are helping.

Noah's Community Outreach receives some grant funding from Rinn UMC, and is also supported by donations in time, resources, and \$ from the congregation.
