

SUMMARY OF SEMINAR SESSIONS

PARENT LEADERSHIP 101

This session will focus on parent leadership and the roles and responsibilities within various parent organizations, including Parent Advisory Councils, Local School Councils, Bilingual Advisory Council, Parent Teacher Organizations, Parent Teacher Associations, and Parent Teacher Student Organizations. Participants will learn how to use Robert's Rules of Order to create agendas, conduct meetings, hold elections, and vote effectively. The seminar will also cover how to establish a quorum and increase parent involvement in these organizations.

SCHOOL LEVEL ORGANIZATIONS

This seminar session is designed to support parent organizations in their efforts to improve their children's education and school communities. Participants will learn about effective strategies for advocacy, decision-making, fundraising, communication, and promoting positive behavior. This session is tailored for specific parent organizations, including Parent Advisory Councils, Local School Councils, Bilingual Advisory Council, Parent Teacher Organizations, Parent Teacher Associations, Parent Teacher Student Organizations, etc. By attending this session, members of parent organizations will gain valuable skills and knowledge to create successful partnerships between parents, teachers, and students, ultimately improving student outcomes and creating a more supportive and inclusive school community.

BUILDING AN EFFECTIVE SCHOOL

This session will focus on the Ten Components of an Effective School and the importance of creating a strong, positive school culture. Parents will work in groups to discuss and share real-life examples that demonstrate how effective schools operate. Through collaboration, participants will identify key qualities such as clear goals, strong parent and community involvement, effective teaching, student support, and a welcoming school climate. Each group will create an action plan highlighting strategies to strengthen school culture, increase engagement, and support continuous improvement in their own school communities.

INCREASE STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT

In this session, we will discuss practical ways in which parents can support their children's academic success, improve their discipline and attendance, and assist the principal in making their school nationally recognized. We will explore strategies for creating a supportive home environment, fostering a love for learning, establishing positive communication with teachers and school administrators, and encouraging community involvement. By working together, parents and educators can help students achieve their full potential and elevate their school to new heights of excellence.

ACTION PLANS I & II

These two sessions will involve creating and finalizing an action plan based on the seminar sessions. Participants will have the opportunity to discuss and develop strategies that will enable them to contribute effectively to their school community.

As a result, parents will learn practical methods for building strong leadership teams, promoting effective communication, and applying the principles of an effective school within their organizations. They will leave with clear, realistic action steps designed to strengthen parent involvement, improve collaboration with school staff, and support a positive and successful school culture.
