The season of Lent begins with Ash Wednesday, March 5, 2025. This is an opportune time for self-reflection and growth. Our faith has taught us that God loves us all so much that He came near to us to remind us all of how truly valuable we are. He is always with us, knowing that at times we struggle to trust in the value of one another. If we don't take time to pause, pray, assess and set our intentions, we can easily be pulled by forces of social anxiety, perhaps seeing our neighbors as enemies, or seeing our community resentfully, and feeling all alone in this world. The more we think about it and worry about it, the more these feelings escalate and can easily overcome us, leading us to feel isolated and burned out.

If we commit to the values of our church, we can continue our lives grounded in God's grace, compassion, humility, and love thereby making the world a better place in which to live.

How will you spend your Lenten season? In the 40 days between Ash Wednesday and Easter (minus Sundays) we can re-establish our relationship with God. Perhaps you can begin with small changes and as they increase, you refocus on the important things in life – you become more patient, more tolerable, more loving. You'll grow and nurture God's loving presence in your life.

Fellowship



I can hardly believe that lent begins on Wednesday, March 5th! Here are some fun facts about Ash Wednesday. It's the day after Mardi Gras, which is when lots of people have a big party to use up their flour and other stuff. The history of Mardi Gras can be traced back to the Middle Ages, when people would eat heartily the night before they had to start fasting on Ash Wednesday. Other traditions sprang up during the Middle Ages including the serving of the king's cake in 12th century France. In early England, this day was a religious day where people confessed their sins in order to get ready for Lent. It was also common tradition to use up all the eggs, milk, and butter in the kitchen prior to Ash Wednesday. These ingredients were often used to make pancakes.

In the Middle Ages ashes were sprinkled on the head instead of drawn in a cross on the forehead like they do now. Many people keep the ashes on their forehead for the entire day. It's a sign that they are sinners and need God's forgiveness.

Since observing Ash Wednesday is not commanded in the Bible, it's optional in some Christian churches to observe it. This includes Lent as well.

The period of 40 days is often used in the Bible.
