GG's Grand Adventure (or Donna and Bill's Great Adventure)

Some of you already know me (GG = Grey Ghost). I've been to several CTCI conventions first on a trailer then came off my trailer after the Memphis Convention (2012). My owner wanted to start driving around our wondrous country. We've driven to multiple conventions: San Diego, Albuquerque, and Flagstaff to name a few. However, this trip was purely for fun!

My owner Donna retired in July 2022 and my mechanic Bill (her husband) wanted to show her areas of this country he had visited with the boys from NJORTC while she was still working. A perfect opportunity arose with the "Thunderbird Extravaganza" hosted by the Sacramento Classic Thunderbird Club. (Continued next page)

So the route out was planned - West 70 to West 50; reservations were made and some sightseeing planned. On May 25th the three of us were off with every inch of me packed with parts, tools and yes some clothes. First night St. Clairsville, Ohio; next day we stayed in Vandalia, Il. and saw a fire breathing dragon (didn't want to get too close); also visited the Statehouse where Abraham Lincoln first started his political career. Had a little hiccup with my starter! We continued to Salina, Kansas did a slight detour to St. Joseph, Mo to see where Jesse James was gunned down and a wonderful museum with all kinds of transportation items, Pony Express history and period storefronts post office, drug store, dentist office, and general store (housed in the Patee House Hotel 1858). Oh no!! another starter or non-starter hiccup. We made it to Salina and decided to call Rich Martin to see what could be done about the starter before he and Lois left to meet us in Sacramento. We decided to do our planned sightseeing in Salina (Steve Fossett : solo nonstop flight of the globe in 2005: 22,936 miles in 67 hours took off from the Salina airport). I guess I shouldn't complain about driving Bill and Donna to California that's only approx. 2,900 miles. Next day Richard called back and advised a new starter was ordered and being shipped directly to Ross Woodman's house (chairperson of the show). Donna called Ross and he advised that another club member, Steve Countryman would bring a jack, jack stands and tools to change out the starter on the show field! WOW! Of course, I made sure there were no more hiccups with my starter going across!

On to Colorado with snow in the mountains and an overflowing Colorado River! Toured the amazing Red Rock Park and Amphitheatre (just missed a hail storm the day before). Bill and Donna did an early morning climb while I rested in the parking lot. Visited a Dinosaur dig site so glad they're not around today (though I guess they wouldn't be worse than those three tandem Fedex trucks on the highway). It was a surprise to see Pronghorns (similar to our deer) and prairie dogs in the wild! We went around and around this windy road to Lookout Mountain elevation 7,377, where the Buffalo Bill Museum and Gravesite is.

We continued seeing snow in the mountains all the way. We arrived in Moab, Utah amazing rock formations in Arches National Park. I felt very small. More winding roads you go around and around to get to the other side of the mountains, again some elevations 7,000 to 9,000 ft (haven't they heard of tunnels?). We ended up in Ely, NV boy I was tired! Stopped to take a photo shoot at a 1940's art deco movie theatre in town. Tomorrow we arrive in Sacramento where my new starter is waiting for me!

We have arrived on June 1st it was great to see the Hamm's and Stubb's cars again after the Covid shutdown. As well as some new car friends from the Sacramento Club. The next day Bill was changing out my starter with help from the supporting staff and tools from everyone - it was a great group effort.

I received a "Spa Treatment" which I really needed and the club had a wonderful wash station with individual buckets, soap, micro clothes, etc..

The show was absolutely fabulous. Great tours planned to an automobile museum (I learned that Henry Ford dabbled in making planes too); McClellan Airport Museum and an Art Museum (which I didn't attend). The show was relaxing and filled with good times and camaraderie. We received a \$100.00 Gift Certificate for our long distance drive.
