

house from George Bristol c. 1872-3 (see ERI-1743). William Henry, born on the island, 1871, helped his father in his vineyards and farm until his marriage to Julia Sheadler (b:1879, KI), daughter of wine maker August and Christine Sheadler (ERI-1654). The young couple made their home for a time with the widowed Christine Sheadler on the island's south shore. Probably soon after his own father's death in 1901, William Henry moved back to the old homestead with his wife in order to help his mother run the farm. It was then, oral tradition indicates, that he built this cottage for Elizabeth. According to the 1910 Census they also took in a number of quarry workers as boarders, but it is not known in which house these men lived.
