


WORD

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION



GOSPEL: John 9:1-41

Narrator: ¹As [Jesus] walked along, he saw a man blind from birth. Congregation: Rabbi, who sinned, this man or his parents, that he was born blind?

Jesus: Neither this man nor his parents sinned; he was born blind so that God's works might be revealed in him. ⁴We must work the works of him who sent me while it is day; night is coming when no one can work. ⁵As long as I am in the world, I am the light of the world.

Narrator: ⁶When he had said this, he spat on the ground and made mud with the saliva and spread the mud on the man's eyes, ⁷saying to him,

Jesus: Go, wash in the pool of Siloam.

Narrator: Then the Blind Man went and washed and came back able to see. ⁸The neighbors and those who had seen him before as a beggar began to ask,

Window Side: Is this not the man who used to sit and beg?

Piano Side: It is he.

Window Side: No, but it is someone like him.

The Man: I am the man.

Congregation: Then how were your eyes opened?

The Man: The man called Jesus made mud, spread it on my eyes, and said to me, 'Go to Siloam and wash.' Then I went and washed and received my sight.

Congregation: Where is he?

The Man: I do not know.

Narrator:¹³They brought to the Pharisees the man who had formerly been blind. ¹⁴Now it was a sabbath day when Jesus made the mud and opened his eyes. ¹⁵Then the Pharisees also began to ask him how he had received his sight.

The Man: He put mud on my eyes. Then I washed, and now I see.

Pharisee: This man is not from God, for he does not observe the sabbath.

Congregation: How can a man who is a sinner perform such signs?

Narrator: And they were divided. ¹⁷So they said again to the blind man,

Pharisee: What do you say about him? It was your eyes he opened."

The Man: He is a prophet.

Narrator:¹⁸The Jews did not believe that he had been blind and had received his sight until they called the parents of the man who had received his sight ¹⁹and asked them, Pharisee: Is this your son, who you say was born blind? How then does he now see?

Parent: We know that this is our son, and that he was born blind; ²¹but we do not know how it is that now he sees, nor do we know who opened his eyes. Ask him; he is of age. He will speak for himself.

Narrator: ²²His parents said this because they were afraid of the Jews; for the Jews had already agreed that anyone who confessed Jesus to be the Messiah would be put out of the synagogue. ²³Therefore his parents said, "He is of age; ask him."

²⁴So for the second time they called the man who had been blind.

Pharisee: Give glory to God! We know that this man is a sinner."

The Man: I do not know whether he is a sinner. One thing I do know, that though I was blind, now I see.

Pharisee: What did he do to you? How did he open your eyes?

The Man: I have told you already, and you would not listen. Why do you want to hear it again? Do you also want to become his disciples?

Pharisee: You are his disciple, but we are disciples of Moses. ²⁹We know that God has spoken to Moses, but as for this man, we do not know where he comes from.

³⁰The man: Here is an astonishing thing! You do not know where he comes from, and yet he opened my eyes. ³¹We know that God does not listen to sinners, but he does listen to one who worships him and obeys his will. ³²Never since the world began has it been heard that anyone opened the eyes of a person born blind. ³³If this man were not from God, he could do nothing.

Pharisee: You were born entirely in sins, and are you trying to teach us?"

Narrator: The leader they drove him out.³⁵Jesus heard that they had driven him out, he sought after him.

Jesus: Do you believe in the Son of Man?

The Man: And who is he, sir? Tell me, so that I may believe in him.

Jesus: You have seen him, and the one speaking with you is he.

The Man: Lord, I believe.

Narrator: The man then worshiped Jesus.

³⁹Jesus: I came into this world for judgment so that those who do not see may see, and those who do see may become blind.

Narrator: ⁴⁰Some of the Pharisees near him heard this and said to him,

Pharisee: Surely we are not blind, are we?

Jesus: If you were blind, you would not have sin. But now that you say, 'We see,' your sin remains.


We lift our prayers to you, O God, trusting in your steadfast love and your promise to renew your whole creation; through Jesus Christ our Savior. **Amen.**

For the kingdom, the power,


