*Ordinance No. 34-1948*

*The Village Council of the Village of New Munich Stearns County, Minn., met in special session*

*Oct. 18-1948 pursuant to due notice given. The members present were: John LeClaine, Edmund Wornat, C. L. Welle, President of the Council.*

*John LeClaine, a member of said Council, offered the following Ordinance and moved its adoption. Edmund Wornat a member of said Council second the motion and put it to vote, all members voted in favor of said Ordinance.*

*Ordinance No. 34-1948*

*Entitled said Ordinance to authorize the Organization of a Fire Department and prescribing the duties of members thereof.*

*The Village Council of the Village of New Munich, Stearns County, Minnesota, do ordain as follows:*

Section 1—The Fire Department of the Village of New Munich, Minnesota shall consist of a Chief Engineer and a first and second assistant Engineer and on company of not less than fifteen, not more than thirty members, to be organized and equipped as a fire fighting organization for the protection against loss by fire of life and property in the Village of New Munich, Minnesota.

Section 2—The Chief Engineer shall have full power and control and command over all persons whomsoever at any fire, and in his absence the next highest officer in command shall have the same power, control and command.

Section 3—The Chief Engineer shall be ex-officio fire warden of said city. He shall make monthly reports to the common council at its regular monthly meetings, of the condition of the city with reference to combustible matter in places in said city likely to cause damage by fire, the condition of mills, forges, factories, chimneys, stoves, furnaces, smoke stacks, and the condition of all other places in said city liable to cause damage by fire.

Section 4—The chief Engineer shall appoint a first and second assistant engineer from the members of the fire department, to be approved by the city council.

Section 5—The compensation for services are hereby fixed as follows: Each member answering to a fire call in response to a fire alarm or department call shall receive the sum of \$.50 per hour for every hour or portion of an hour spent in or while engaged in fighting fires, extinguishing the same or preventing the spread of fires. It shall be the duty of the chief engineer to report to the common council the names of all persons so entitled to compensation, together with the amount of such compensation, provided that any person not included in such report may present his bill to said council.

Section 6—It shall be the duty of the chief engineer to see that all apparatus committed to his care, and the rooms in which they are deposited, are kept neat and clean and in order for immediate use. He shall examine the same from time to time and report the condition thereof to the common council, as also the condition of hydrants and all the equipment of the department, at the regular meetings of said council.

Section 7—No wagon, dray, cart, steam car or other vehicle shall be driven over the hose belonging to the Village of New Munich, laid in the streets at any fire in the city, or at any other time.

Section 8—All ordinances and parts of ordinances inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

Section 9—Any person convicted of a violation of any of the provisions of Section seven of this ordinance shall be punished by a fine of not to exceed one hundred dollars, or shall be confined in the village jail of said village, or the county jail of Stearns County, Minnesota, for a period of not to exceed ninety days.

Section 10—This ordinance shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and publication.
