This Easter season series dips into the Acts of the Apostles as a way of examining the witness of the one who first experienced the Resurrection. Their story, as they struggled to find a way to live out the implications of this amazing news, this

gospel event, becomes our story as we too seek to bear witness to the Risen Christ and to live that witness daily.

The season after Easter is where we consider what it means to walk with Jesus into eternity. But it is not about life after death, or rather not only about life after death. It is very much about life before death, life in the face of death. It is about life and about bearing witness to a life that resembles a kin-dom existence right here and right now. It is this life, this justice and righteousness, this hope and this glory to which we can say with confidence, "We are witnesses."



April 17, 2022: Let our prayers be prayers of celebration of the gift that Easter is, but also for the strength to live into the promise of new life. Let there be a call to new life and new living. And that life is lived out loud in as public a way as possible. And the light and life of Easter invites us to see all that is still of death in our world—not just in our individual hearts, but in our community and in our world. We give witness to new possibilities and new hope because of Easter. We give witness to the end of hate, the end of war, the end of division, and the end of injustice. Because of Easter, we are witnesses to a new kin-dom—because God raised Jesus from the dead.



April 24, 2022: Peter declares in his defense, "We are witnesses." They told him that he wasn't supposed to teach in the name of the crucified one, and yet he did it. So, what is the defense? We are witnesses. He says we saw something, and we have to talk about it. We participated in something, and we have to talk about it. More than that, he says we became something and there is nothing we can do but be proclaimers of this word. "We are witnesses" does not simply mean they are telling what they saw or what happened to them. It also means they have now become something new, something more, and they have to live out that proclamation every day of their lives. With every word, every encounter, every action, they are witnessing to that which defines their lives in a new and profound way.

It's April, and Easter is right around the corner, which makes me reflect on new beginnings. So, naturally I check myself and my motivations to be healthy. Asking why? Maybe you are in this very place.

What should motivate Christians to be healthy? Why does God desire that we be healthy? Here are two excerpts from the book <u>Faith and Health</u>, written by Charles Reynolds Brown (past Dean of the Yale Divinity School) and published in 1910. "The Lord of Love is seeking to banish fear, to bestow



confidence, to increase faith, to promote healing. He too is desirous that you should gain peace, develop strength, obtain happiness and enter into his rest which remains for the people of God. While you are working out your own salvation by systematic, persistent effort, God is working with you and for you to accomplish his good pleasure." "The Church of Jesus Christ ought to 'teach health,' not as its chief business, but as a leaf on the tree of its main purpose, which, as already indicated, is to produce the good fruit of Christian character and service."

Why Should Christians Be Healthy? To Bear Fruit in Our Lives

God wants us to be healthy so that we can experience the good "fruit" he has in store for us. The more fruit we have in our life the more glory God receives.

What kind of fruit does God desire us to experience and have a part in?

- Winning souls to Christ. Romans 1:13
- Sharing what we have with those in need. Romans 15:25-28
- Developing Christ-like character the fruit of the Spirit. Galatians 5:22-23
- Praising God and giving thanks. Hebrews 13:15

John says that there is no greater **joy** for those who win souls. <u>3 John 3-4</u> The believer also has great **happiness** when they share their possessions with others – "It is more blessed to give than to receive." <u>Acts 20:35</u> In this verse, the word blessed can be translated "oh how very happy," so there is a greater happiness in giving than receiving. When we give, we can also experience great **peace**. <u>Philippians 4:6-7</u> says that we can have the kind of peace which surpasses all understanding. These three emotions of joy, happiness and peace are a few key ingredients which foster good health.

But good health should not be desired as an end in and of itself. God desires us to have good health, and the emotional and physical energy typically associated with it, because this better enables us to have more fruit in our lives and to better use the gifts and talents that he has given to us to serve others and to serve him. When these things happen, we are in God's will. When we're in God's will, he is glorified. This is why God desires a Christian to be healthy.

"Dear friend, I pray that you may enjoy good health and that all may go well with you, even as your soul is getting along well." 3 John 1:2

Questions to Reflect On:

What is your motivation to be healthy and well?

Is it your experience that the healthier you are the better enabled you are to serve God and others with the gifts he's given you?

Florida United Methodist Children's Home Update

We have the end of year giving information for 2021 for our Methodist Children's Home. Our financial goal for the year was \$1,908.00 (159 members at \$12 per member). For 2021, we gave \$8,047.00 to the Children's Home; so, we gave 422% of goal! We give God the glory as we thank you, each and every one of our Burton family, for your love, your prayers, and your stewardship in this mission.



In 2022 our goal of \$12.00 per member will remain the same as it was in 2021. We have four Fifth Sunday offerings this year to help us meet our goal – January 30, May 29, July 31, and October 30.

Since the Children's Home is an extension of the United Methodist churches in Florida, the goal of giving is set each year at the Florida Annual Conference in Lakeland. Also, each Sunday that we partake in Communion (the first Sunday of the month), the "Penny Jug" gladly accepts your pennies, nickels, dimes, and quarters.
